WHAT FRAGRANCE ARE YOU?

the grass started coming out of the winter season showing new shades of bright, beautiful green, which, unfortunately required the mowing to begin. Along with the change of the season came beautiful fragrances drifting through the air.

I know freshly mowed grass and all the new blooms creates misery for those who deal with allergies, and I'm sorry for that, but I must admit I love the accompanying smells. I'm not good with names of flowers for the season so I had to do some research. Some with beautiful spring/summer fragrances are lilac, hyacinth, sweet alyssum, wisteria, sweet peas, lily-of-the valley, gardenia, roses, four o'clock's, peonies, some tulips, magnolia, and jonguils, just to name a few. I can almost smell some of them now. Can you?

Did you know there is a fragrance, or an aroma, that comes from our life? It can be a pleasant aroma, or it can be one that stinks. To stink sounds rather harsh, but Isaiah 1:13-23 talks about ways of living that are a stench in the nostrils of God—lives once pure, once faithful, once just and righteous but no longer bring pleasure to God. How sad . . . but, in this same portion of scripture the Lord says that no matter how deep the stain of your sins, He can remove it and make it as clean as freshly fallen snow.

Let me go back to the beautiful fragrance—that which is pleasing to our Lord . . .

II Corinthians 2:15 & 16: For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing. To the one we are the aroma of death to death, and to the other the aroma of life to life.

If we are God's children, saved by grace, we are a sweet aroma to Him. We no longer have the aroma of death, we have a fragrance that brings joy to the heart of God. Jesus' life was a fragrant aroma to the Father. If we walk as Jesus, do our best to follow His ways, then our lives can have that fragrance. It is our aroma of praise to God, and as we go into our world we take with us the sweet aroma of God everywhere we go.

Ephesians 5:2: Jesus said, "And walk in love, just as Christ also loved you, and gave Himself up for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God as a fragrant aroma."

NEWNESS OF LIFE BY GINNY EDWARDS (PARAPHRASED)

Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life (Romans 6:4 NKJV).

I love that phrase, "newness of life". It reminds me of God's mercy and how He is always ready to give us a fresh start. Spring reminds me of the newness of life, too. Everything just seems to come alive again. And then there are all the birds nesting, ducklings and goslings waddling around behind their mothers. To me it proves that God loves new things, new beginnings, and new hope for the future.

Notice how this scripture in Romans talks about dying and being buried first, before it talks about walking in "newness of life". My pastor once created a challenge within myself during one of his sermons when he said, "If you're not walking in this newness of life, maybe its because you haven't died". It challenged me not only in my spiritual walk, but also in other areas of my life. If you hold on to your old ways, or compromise your core values and beliefs, you really haven't "died" to the old ways.

What do you do when find yourself reverting back to old habits, old thought patterns, and old destructive behaviors? Do you have a plan in place to combat the desire to revert back to your old ways? How do you climb out of that place if you find that you have slipped back into old patterns?



One year I decided my theme for the year was going to be "My First Ascent". I wanted to climb to a higher spiritual place. But one thing I discovered was there are many snags, hard places, and sharp rocks along the climb! But when I thought about this principle of death coming before life, and I really meditated on what my core values are, I realized that some of those snags were because I hadn't really died to my old ways.

So if you find that you're going back and forth, up and down, and every other way, remember this: you are promised newness of life, but you must be willing to "die" to the old ways and embrace that newness that God wants to give you. You can't have it both ways.
