Rev. Skipworth served on the Board of Directors for Black Girl Health Foundation from 2020-2021, a non-profit developed to increase health literacy and reduce health disparities among women of color. Among her accolades, Rev. Skipworth is the recipient the 2019 African American Love Feast Award for community involvement in the York, PA area, and a 2016 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services Supervisor Award for acquisition strategy development and health data research.

Rev. Skipworth earned a Bachelor of Business Administration Degree in Marketing from Howard University (Magnum Cum Laude), a Master of Public Administration from Penn State University (Cum Laude) and is currently undertaking a PhD in Church and Ministry Leadership at Lancaster Bible College.
