ETHEL HARTMAN SCHOLARSHIP Scholarship Regulations – <u>Undergraduate</u> Stipulations for applying for the Ethel Hartman Scholarship

- 1. The applicant must be an active member for at least one year of the New Brunswick Church of Christ, or a past member of New Brunswick Church of Christ who is presently actively involved in a Church of Christ church elsewhere.
- 2. The applicant must be attending or plan to attend an approved Christian Church/Church of Christ College.

Procedure for applying for an Ethel Hartman Scholarship

- The application and all information listed below must be completed by the candidate or designate party and submitted to the New Brunswick Church of Christ Mission Team for screening of information. The Mission Team will then submit their recommendation for final approval To the elders of the New Brunswick Church of Christ.
 - A. A 500 to 1,000 word typed essay "Why I desire to go to a Christian Church/Church of Christ College".
 - B. Transcript of high school grades or college if in college
 - C. Completed Minister's evaluation form in a sealed envelope.
 - D. Completed elder's evaluation form in a sealed envelope.
- 2. The applicant considered for final selection for a scholarship may be required to attend an interview session with the Mission Team and or New Brunswick Church of Christ elders.
- 3. Applications should be returned to the New Brunswick Church of Christ office.
- 4. The applicant will be advised of the decision concerning their application.
- 5. All scholarship awards given will be for one year or one semester only. Previous year's recipients may reapply the following year. Their application must include a copy of their transcript from both semesters of the previous year.

Stipulations for terminating an Ethel Hartman Scholarship

- 1. The stipulations for receiving an Ethel Hartman Scholarship are binding throughout the recipient's education. A previous recipient <u>will not</u> be considered for another year's scholarship if <u>any</u> of the following conditions apply.
 - A. If a recipient does not maintain at least a "C" or 2.0 grade point average.
 - B. If a recipient transfers to a college other than an approved Christian Church/Church of Christ college.
- 2. The Scholarship Team and /or elders reserve the right to terminate a scholarship for what a majority of them believe to be academic incompetence, immorality, or unbecoming conduct on the part of the recipient of an Ethel Hartman Scholarship.
