## **SESSION 10**

## HEBREWS 5.11 - 6.8

Context: There never was a time when the Father could not say to the Second Person within the resonating reality of the Trinity, "Thou art My Son." But there came a day in history when, by resurrection in glorified humanity, God the Son was begotten to a new status as the exalted God/Man, equipped to accomplish the salvation of men in the laying down of his life for sin.

Learning Targets For Enduring Understanding From This Session:

- 1. To understand that maturity in Christ is founded upon the personal revelation of truth as the Holy Spirit upon the Word of God equips you to discern good from evil lest you be led astray.
- The true implantation of the Holy Spirit within a soul is a sovereign fact-it is once for all, and the progressive soul-surrender thereafter yields the fruits of righteousness that authenticate the indwelling Truth. True salvation is an unstoppable journey to Mt Zion whereupon Christ in you the hope of glory is fully realized.
