## SESSION 26

## HEBREWS 11.17-28

Context: The two components of faith, the conviction of the existence of our absolute sovereign God and the assurance that He will fulfill all His promises to the believer, are powerfully manifested in the lives of the Old Testament saints. These have had the promise of the Kingdom of God revealed to them, have greeted that revelation with enduring hope and quiet joy, and thereby have defined themselves as citizens of The Kingdom over and against all other nationalistic, cultural, or creedal identification. These are the holy ones of God's choosing and He is pleased to identify Himself with them.

Revelation---Confidence---Endurance--- Glory --- = Faith Revelation---Response---Identification---Holiness

Learning Targets For Enduring Understanding From This Session: Faith is manifested in an infinite multitude of ways that crosscut all of history and culture. A willing, expectant, obedient heart is the premier outworking of an authentic faith that embraces without question God's existence and promises.

Such faith turned a way of darkness into a pathway of hope...Abraham learned the kind of working to expect from God, His way of solving life's darkest problems.
