The best-selling book *The Shack* by William Young which we read in our Wednesday Bible Study a while back is now a movie.



A potpourri of these things from my reading ...

Gospel means good news.... For Christians, of course, the good news is Jesus Christ, who died and rose again, taking the whole of God's wrath upon himself and setting us free. The gospel announces that on account of Christ's death and resurrection, we are justified by grace through faith: not by what we do, or even by who we are, but by what Christ has done and who he is. Our guilt has been atoned for and the deepest judgment satisfied, opening up the reconciliation of sinners with a holy God and life eternal. "For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!" (Rom. 5:10).

... the gift of Christ is unconditional. Like all true gifts, it arrives unbidden—a great and glorious surprise for those who don't deserve one. His affection cannot be leveraged or merited. It is a gift with no strings attached. Jesus simply gave—his attention, his power, his very self—and to the wrong people. (David Zahl, "Justify Yourself," *Christianity Today*, J/F 2017, 39-40)

Testimony means personal witness—stating what you can't but believe is true. Theology always involves testimony of some kind, since its subject cannot be a matter of disinterested inquiry. One is either passionately interested in God or it is not God that one is interested in. (David Heim, "Preface," *How My Mind Has Changed*. vii)

We are not doing discipleship very well. When I started looking into discipleship, I discovered that discipleship is just "Christian-ship"—becoming more like Jesus. So if we are not doing discipleship well, then we are not doing Christian well. (Preston Sprinkle, Discipleship: Reclaiming Our Neglected Mandate," *Outreach Magazine*, J/F 2017, 69)

The Bible, I have learned, welcomes doubters and wrestlers. Job asks questions; God does too. Abraham argues, as well as believes. Sarah waits, but in laughter. Moses obeys, but also insists. Psalmists believe, but they rage as well. There is celebration, but also lament. Amos judges, but also blesses. Peter follows, but doubts too. Paul persecutes, but also repents. All of this is incredibly rich vocabulary for the range of feelings, relationships, experiences, questions, doubts, and hopes experienced throughout human life. The authentication of the Bible's authority appears in in witness to what it means to be human and in its witness to the God who made us to be so. [Note: Since we only report on each mission semi-annually, some of the information provided may seem like "old" news, but it isn't really.]

INTERNATIONAL DISASTER EMERGENCY SERVICES, INC. (IDES)

As the name indicates IDES is an international disaster relief service which is associated with the Christian Church and Churches of Christ. First Christian Church has for some time supported various special needs requests that IDES sent out on a situation-by-situation basis, but last year it was decided to include IDES in our regular monthly-supported missions as well.

In 2016 survivors of disasters received help in their times of need, hungry people were fed, sick children and adults were cared for, entire families in developing countries gained a better quality of life, and people from many nations and cultures believed and obeyed Jesus as a result of IDES ministries.

Immediately following Hurricane Matthew many IDES supporters helped to donate over \$100,000 in aid to several mission partners in Haiti. In Kenya IDES was blessed with the chance to provide emergency food in three different regions during the drought season.

IDES has worked with trusted mission partners in Thailand to meet some basic needs of Burmese refugees living along the Thai/Myanmar border. IDES has given more than \$250,000 in relief to these refugees over the past two years. Among those helped were more than 600 refugees in the city of Mae Sot, living not in an organized refugee camp but in the local landfill. In addition to this assistance, IDES continuously prays for God to show a more lasting solution to this desperate situation. They are now trying to procure property outside the dump for the younger children to come for instruction, medical care, and physical nutrition. The total cost for this property and school/medical building is about \$300,000. IDES is taking a step of faith that this will be accomplished in 2017.

BELLA VITA PREGNANCY RESOURCE CENTER



Who are we? We are a local non-profit organization who is a partner of Care Net. Care Net is a network of more than 1100 pregnancy resource centers. We affirm the value of life by providing practical, emotional, and spiritual support to the client. All Service are free and confidential.

- Pregnancy tests peer guided, self administered.
- Pregnancy options counseling advocates help women examine all three options: parenting, adoption, and abortion.
- Peer counseling trained advocates care for clients, and address physical, emotional, and spiritual concerns.
- Community referrals for medical care, material assistance, licensed adoption agencies, and other community resources.
- Education classes are offered on such topics as sexual abstinence, self esteem, healthy relationships, nutrition, newborn care and development, natural family planning, parenting, discipline, breastfeeding, and SIDS prevention.
- "Baby Bucks" program clients are able to earn needed maternity clothes, baby clothes, diapers, and baby furniture.
- Men's Issues support trained male advocates assist men with pregnancy, relationship, parenting, and post-abortion concerns.
