


Now the movie seeks to capture the journey that Lee personally made to move from atheist to an world-renown defender of Christ.

Although just born and very much still in its infancy, the church now has a presence on Facebook. You may "follow us" at **First Christian Church—Knox, Indiana**. I am new, and I mean NEW, at this but will do my best to make regular posts that will hopefully be of interest to you. But, please, be patient! (Note: If your are proficient with Facebook, HELP!)

For the remainder of my space, I want to borrow from Mark Pike's *Campus Minister's Notebook* in a recent newsletter we received from Ball State's Christian Student Foundation. As the song says, "I can only imagine" what would happen if we here at First Christian Church would put into practice what they hope to see practiced by the students involved with the Christian Campus House. I will bracket [] the words and phrases I have changed from a CSF-meaning to a FCC-meaning.

"We want to state these expectations clearly and coach [members] in developing consistency in these practices. Above all, we want [members] to see this list as an opportunity to grow in Christ and to make Him visible in their life.

"The Bible: Read the Bible daily with intent to hear the word of God. Attend a weekly Bible study.

"Prayer: Engage in daily conversational prayer with God for your own spiritual growth, the needs of others, the opportunity to share the gospel of Christ and for the ministry of [First Christian Church].

"Worship: Attend the weekly worship service at [FCC] on a regular and consistent basis in order to honor God and to encourage each other in [First Christian Church].

"Serve: Seek opportunities each day to serve people, following the example of Christ in humility and obedience.

"Welcome: Develop the practice of welcome and hospitality at [First Christian Church] and [in our community], reflecting the ministry of Christ.

"Invite: Develop the practice of inviting [acquaintances] to events and meetings of [First Christian Church]. Invite someone at least once a month.

"Develop the practice of conversation with [people] you do not well, at least once a month. Season your speech with grace and truth in order to build up the other person. Listen to the leading of the Holy Spirit for opportunities to encourage and build them up.

"Testimony: Be able to share your testimony of how Christ has changed your life and your devotion to God.

"Gospel: Practice sharing the gospel of Christ at least twice [semi-annually], once with someone at [First Christian Church] and once with a friend who is not involved with [FCC]. The goal is to practice sharing the gospel with believers so you will be prepared to do so with a seeker who wants to know what it means to follow Christ."

Ball State Christian Student Foundation

The Fall semester began August 22. The first eight days of the semester were exciting and busy as well as challenging with multiple days of rain. CSF had a successful Open House followed by SnoJam on the following night. Clarksburg Christian Church shared a delicious meal with international students and then on Sunday CSF welcomed new students to stay after worship for Fazoli's. On Wednesday Tri-County Christian Church grilled for CSF and joined them in worship. And, CSF's first men's and women's activities were successful in spite of the rain.

Students are involved in Brotherhood groups for the guys and Faith groups for the women. CSF has broadened their horizons to focus on an even greater presence on campus than what they have had in the past. They are planning a variety of outreaches including handing out free Bibles. At the end of September they reserved the multi-purpose room at Park Hall for a coffeehouse/open mic night.

The following is what CSF is all about: Three years ago, Jenna came to the Campus House with her friend Jessica. She was a freshman who had been on campus for a few months. As a senior, on November 6 (2016), Jenna began a new journey in her life. As she shared on Facebook, "A few weeks ago the Holy Spirit was really pressing on my heart while thinking about baptism and so I had a meeting with my pastor at campus House and I made the choice to get baptized. Today was the momentous day and I couldn't be happier. Thank you to everyone who was there to witness this step in my life."

Last year CSF announced the development of a permanent endowment fund supporting their ministry. The goal of the *Legacy Fund*, as it is called, is \$320,000 by 2020. This fund is being supported by every director and staff member who together pledged \$102,000 in the fall of 2016. CSF's hope is to raise the remaining pledges by the end of this year. It is anticipated that by 2020 the *Legacy Fund* will provide 10% of CSF's annual budget need. Please pray for this ambitious endeavor.

LRCA

At the end of the summer last year, LRCA had completed its 91st season of camping. This again was made possible through the prayers, the work, and the sacrifices of many people who still see Camp LRCA as a vital ministry. This is an especially significant accomplishment in light of the very serious financial situation the Camp had been led into a couple of years ago.

"Improving but not there yet" would be the way I would summarize LRCA's current status. Here is how the still new Executive Director Matt Chandler stated it in the winter newsletter:

"Everything is not solved and while we will have camp in 2017 and 2018, the future of camp is not yet firmly secured. The truth is we have a lot of work before us. I say "we" because this will take a team effort. LRCA is in the midst of changing its organizational structure and re-evaluating every area of the ministry to ensure many more years of meaningful ministry are possible. We are faced with a seemingly endless list of projects to be done, an increase in the number of scholarships being requested, an amazing but overworked volunteer base, improving but weak connections with our churches and the list could go on and on. We want to let churches and volunteers know that we are here and would love to work with them. This is an exciting time in the life of Camp LRCA because God has given us the opportunity to move from surviving, to stability,


