- "Who Can Forgive Sin but God": The religious leaders knew that to accept Christ's declaration of the man's sins being forgiven, meant they would have to accept the fact that Jesus was the Lord from Heaven. This they were not willing or ready to do.
- "Eats And Drinks With Publicans...Sinners": Christ demonstrated that it was necessary to associated or connect with the sinner to gain entrance into their heart with the gospel. In spite of the view of some, this was not the same as associating or participating in their sin.
- "The Sabbath Was Made For Man.": The Sabbath had evolved into nothing more than a ritualistic day of rules and regulations, when initially the Sabbath had been established and designed for man's rest and communion with God. A day to refresh and revive oneself in the presence of the Lord.

"Hosanna": Meaning • "Save!", which was a declaration of praise announcing that they believed Christ was arriving on the scene to save the nation of Israel as the Messiah thev had been looking for, for so long.

"House Of Prayer": A strong reminder to those who were only seeing the temple as a place of profit, instead of a place of praver.

- "Believe That You • Receive Them": This is translated as being in the past tense. In other words, the prayer of faith declares that what has been requested is now done, even before it has been manifested visibly.
- "By What Authority": • In modern day terms, it would be like saying: "So who do you think you are anyway?" A statement to discredit the one being addressed.

- "Crucify Him": The Roman crucifixion was specifically designed to inflict the greatest amount of pain over the longest period of time. An extreme form of capitol punishment, usually lasting for a period of 36 hours or more.
- **"Forsaken Me":** Because of the holiness of God, our sins being laid upon the life of Christ at Calvary, required that God the Father had to turn away from, and lift his presence from the Lord at that point in time.
- "The Veil Of The Temple": The very moment of Christ's death on Calvary, was the climactic event that removed the barrier of separation between God and those who would desire to experience God's Presence. God used the tearing of the temple veil or curtain to illustrate this new reality.
