Registration Information:

***Pre-Registration:** Your registration form must be turned into your pastor no later than July 1st.

***Camp Registration:** All completed forms with payment must be submitted at registration. The medical form must be complete with parent/guardian, & pastor's signatures, medical insurance information, and emergency contacts. Medications to be taken by students must be turned into camp nurse during the registration process.

***Cost and Payment:** Jr – HS Camp are \$215 for the week. If you have multiple children in your family, the first child is \$215 and all others are \$200. The young adult retreat is \$30/person or \$50 /couple. **Camp T-shirts cost an additional \$10** which will be collected during camp registration. Snack purchases are limited to \$2 a day/ \$10 a week. Please do not bring any additional money to camp.

***Camp opening and closing times:** Cabin Assignments: Begin at 10AM the first day of camp! We find it most beneficial for the camp that campers from the same church be distributed among the cabins. For this reason we need flexibility in cabin assignments. We make every effort to meet camper's **one cabin mate preference**. Camp activities begin with noon meal on Monday. Camp concludes Saturday at 10:00AM after camp cleanup. All campers must be picked up by 11:00 AM on the last day of camp.

Camp Rules

Because this is a Christian camp, dedicated to the Lord Jesus Christ, we want to honor Him in all we do.

The rules provide a basis for our goal.

1. Campers will take part in all scheduled activities to their ability, and attend all meetings.
2. Counselors are to be respected and obeyed as those over you in the Lord.
3. Proper Christian conduct will be expected in boy-girl relationships; ie: no holding hands, hugging, sitting on laps, kissing etc
4. Clothes worn at camp, including swimsuits, should reflect modesty and not promote drugs, tobacco products, or alcohol. Shoes and shirts must be worn in the dining room and chapel.
5. The following items are not allowed at camp; tobacco, alcoholic beverages, drugs, knives, guns (incl. air-soft, water guns, etc.), fireworks, inappropriate magazines or literature, music players (iPod, mp3, etc.), cell phones, DVD players, laptops or items for pranking purposes (listed but not limited to: shaving cream, balloons, etc) .
6. No camper may leave the campgrounds without permission from the camp dean.
7. To enhance the camp experience for all campers, we ask that no visitors come to camp during the camp week. If a visit is necessary, we request this to be approved by the camp dean PRIOR to the visit.
8. No one will leave his cabin after evening curfew without the counselor's consent. Each camper is expected to be in his/her cabin at the time announced by the Dean.
9. Campers are requested to turn in their extra money to the camp canteen fund to be drawn out as needed for canteen purchases. The balance will be returned at the end of the week.

We do not anticipate discipline problems, but occasionally there is a problem that is more difficult to deal with than we feel is appropriate. After we have exhausted our progressive disciplinary procedures, we have at times in the past found it necessary to call on the parents or pastor of the camper's church to come and take the child home. We expect the understanding and the cooperation of parents, guardians, and churches.
