

“He said yes” weekly faith challenge from 3-18-18

Day 1

2 Corinthians 5:17 *“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.”*

“This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!”

Sometimes when we look at where we are in our spiritual journey and where we want to be, we get discouraged. Today, instead of looking at where you need to grow, look back at where you’ve come from.

Jot down a list of “the old that is gone” and “the new that has begun”.

Soak in that reality and praise God in whatever way fits you. (a prayer, a journal entry, a song, a note/text/email to a friend celebrating God’s work; an artistic expression...)

Day 2

Matthew 6:33 *“Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”*

Is there an area of your life where is God asking you to seek Him first? Jot it down

What step(s) might you take to move in that direction and say yes?

Which of the “all these things” do you struggle trusting God for? Jot it down

Now, prayerfully release it and your anxiety into His hands.

Day 3

Philippians 1:6 *“God began doing a good work in you, and I am sure he will continue it until it is finished when Jesus Christ comes again.”*

In what ways is this an encouragement to you today?

Jot down a prayer of thanks, be specific.

Day 4

2 Corinthians 1:20

“For no matter how many promises God has made, they are “Yes”

“For all of God’s promises have been fulfilled in Christ with a resounding “Yes!”

“Whatever God has promised gets stamped with the Yes of Jesus.”

Spend a few minutes soaking in this verse; read it over and over, say it slowly, say it out loud.

What are you trusting God for at this time of your life?

What promises are you holding on to?

In light of these responses; what does 2 Corinthians 1:20 mean to you. Jot it down.

Day 5- He said yes!

Luke 9:51

“When the days drew near for Him to be taken up, He set his face to go to Jerusalem.”

Sit with this verse for five minutes

Let your heart and mind consider what it meant for Jesus to “set his face to go to Jerusalem.”

Write out a prayer response to the reality that Jesus said yes.

What does it mean to you?
