May Is Music Month at St. Andrew's

May is a big month for music at St. Andrew's, as we have several offerings which wind up the end of the 2016-17 choir season. Mark your calendars now for each of these special events.

On Sunday, May 14 at 5:00 p.m., the Parish Choir of St. Andrew's will be singing Choral Evensong. Not only is this a fitting "official" end to our choir year, but we are also recognizing the retirement and contributions of one of our long-standing members. Doug Chenault, who sings in the bass section, has been singing at St. Andrew's regularly for 20 years, and for many years before that was a frequent guest singer. Doug has had a long career in Norfolk, having sung in several church and civic choirs. Music for the service will include the Magnificat & Nunc dimittis in A by William H. Harris. At Doug Chenault's request, the anthem will be the *Cantique de Jean Racine*, a beautiful lyrical work by Gabriel Faure'. Two traditions that I have enjoyed with previous choirs are coming together in this Evensong: a celebration of the Parish Choir's work over the past year, and honoring the retirement of a singer who has dedicated several decades to making music in the church, and particularly ours.

On Friday, May 19 at 7:30 p.m., we will be hosting Brad Norris, along with Ian Robinson (cello) and Dan Waddill (baritone), in a program of organ solo works as well as instrumental and vocal combinations. This program is part of the Organ Swell series in conjunction with the Virginia Arts Festival,

Brad Norris is the Minister of Music of our sister parish on the peninsula, St. Andrew's in Newport News. This will be a varied program that will surely have wide appeal. A reception will follow the concert at which you will be able to meet Brad and the other artists. There is a suggested admission donation of \$10 per adult, which helps meet the expenses of the series and ensure that it continues.

Building on last year's great success, we are once again participating with the choirs of Christ & St. Luke's and St. Paul's for the second annual Hymn Festival for Ascension, which will take place at Christ & St. Luke's on Thursday, May 25 at 7:00 p.m. This year's festival, with the theme "Why Stand Ye Gazing into Heaven?", will be led by Todd Wilson, Organist-Choirmaster of Trinity Cathedral in Cleveland, Ohio, and a member of the faculty at the Cleveland Conservatory. An recitalist with an international reputation, Todd Wilson will be improvising on featured hymns and conducting the combined choirs in *God is gone up* by Gerald Finzi, *Let us love in deed and truth* by Larry King, and *Surrexit a mortuis* by Charles Marie Widor. In addition to the music, there will also be readings appropriate to the Feast of the Ascension.

Vestry Updates

At our March Vestry meeting, the Vestry welcomed Harper Lewis, Director of Children's and Youth Ministry. Harper shared her insights and vision for our children's and youth programs, and solicited feedback and support from the Vestry. Upcoming highlights include Vacation Bible School and a possible mission trip to Raleigh this summer.

In the Rector's Update, The Rev. John Rohrs noted that we will be transitioning to the use of Constant Contact for our weekly e-newsletter and other special announcements. Thanks to Dennis Sipes and Harper Lewis for taking the lead on that. The website will also be upgraded this summer to the newest platform available. Parishioner Jill Pollard is working on that for us.

Sometimes we all need to be reminded of the statistics: more than 41,000 blood donations are needed every day in the U.S.. This comes out to just under 15 million units that are needed annually. How many blood donors are there? About 9.2 million. Although 38% of us are eligible nors and volunteers are outside of to donate blood, only about 10% of us actually do and many give no more than once per year. We also

Education for Ministry (EfM)



What is Education for Ministry **(EfM)?** Although it sounds like it, those who take this course are not training to be ordained ministers. Rather, through reading, discussion, and reflection, they are determining what their personal ministry will be in this world. The Episcopal Church believes that every baptized person is called to ministry. EfM is designed to help you explore what that ministry might be.

The 4 year course curriculum covers the Bible, church history, and theology. This is not a Bible

study course, however. Using a one-room school approach, students from all four years gather and discuss how the readings impact them - what was amazing, what was confusing, what was troubling, as well as what was delightful. They look for linkages in the lessons from each year, how what is in the Bible is reflected in history and is currently seen today. Each year we have a resource and guide book that has a theme that is carried throughout the year. Last year's theme was living faithfully in a multicultural world while this year's theme has been how to live spiritually as a mature Christian.

During the year the students share their spiritual journeys. Each student is encouraged, through the process of theological reflection, to look at what they are learning, how the material is related to our culture and what is happening in the world today, as well as how the content impacts their personal ministry.

The EfM program is presented in a seminar format to 6-10 participants led by mentor Carolyn Moneymaker. Beginning in September and ending in May, the group meets each Tuesday from 6:30 pm to 9:00 pm. The course is \$350 per year (scholarships are available). Students need not commit to the entire four years.
