Dear friends,

As we enter this season of Advent, I am reminded of a poem by Ralph Spaulding Cushman that begins:

Let not our hearts be busy inns, That have no room for Thee, But cradles for the living Christ And His nativity.

This poem makes me think about how we make room in the inns of our hearts this season as we await the coming of Christ. The ways that we do this will look different for each of us. Some find that taking on a discipline of extra prayer and reflection is a meaningful way to prepare. There are wonderful books of Advent meditations available, and that may work for you.

For years, I have tried this approach, only to find myself busier than ever in the weeks leading up to Christmas and frustrated by my failure to figure out how to make time for "the reason for the season" with extra prayer and study. This year, I am trying a different approach. Rather than trying to fit more in, even if it is meaningful, I am trying to find meaning in the things that I am already doing. My hope is that writing Christmas cards to friends and loved ones far away is a prayerful act of thanksgiving for what they have meant to me. Instead of feeling guilty about participating in the consumerism that surrounds this season, I am going to focus on the fact that choosing and giving gifts is an expression of generosity and love, and we do so in celebration of the gift we have received in Jesus Christ. And as I host and attend special parties and meals, I am going to remember that preparing for guests is, in some way, preparing for Christ and that our fellowship is a manifestation of God's love in the world.

I don't know how this new approach will work, but I am giving it a try. My prayer for each of us is that in the holy weeks ahead, we find our own ways to make room for the coming of Christ in the inns of our hearts.

Jr. Warden's Letter

Greetings, we are closing in on another year and look forward to 2014 and the projects we can complete together. I know some of you may think that there cannot possibly be that much left to do after our major renovation. The answer is that there is quite a lot to be done that we could not do at the time.

A few examples 1) the sanctuary has not had plaster repairs or been painted in over twenty years. We have a plastering quote and are awaiting bids from several painting contractors. 2) The lighting in the sanctuary needs to be upgraded by replacing the bulbs in the chandeliers with LED bulbs and floods and replacing any faulty wiring also installing new dimmers switches. 3) We also need to move forward with the landscaping of the patio area and with the addition of benches which will make the patio much more enjoyable for our parish and guest. We are presently waiting for a proposal for planting that will include an annual schedule and drawings of what we can expect the area to look like when completed.

We also need to keep in mind that unexpected problems can arise without warning that need immediate attention and may put a burden on our operations budget. As we approach the end of the year it an excellent time to consider additional donations which will help to accomplish our goals, money designated for the planting of the patio or help

towards purchasing patio furniture or even helping to offset the cost of new sanctuary light will all be greatly appreciated.
