## Tuesday, December 27: Read Psalm 95:2

List 5 things you are thankful for that doesn't come wrapped up under a Christmas tree. (Example: warm home)

## Wednesday, December 28: Read Psalm 100

This chapter reminds us to (circle one):

- Complain
- Be thankful
- Exercise

## Friday, December 30: Read Luke 2:1-20, John 3:16

What is one thing you have learned about Jesus and His birth during this Christmas season?

## Saturday, December 31: Read Lamentations 3:22-24, 2 Corinthians 5:17

What are some things you might ask Jesus to help you do well this year? (Examples: Be more obedient to your parents. Study harder. Read Bible more often.)

## Saturday January 1 to Tuesday January 11
