
STUFF

I did a little survey with the Kindergarten through Sixth graders who were here this past Wednesday night. I wanted to see what things I need to focus on and what things I might need to pass along to parents. They didn't put their names on their papers, so don't panic.

Here are some of the results.



They all say they talk with their parents about God and Jesus pretty regularly. They all say they talk with their parents about what they learned in church at least sometimes and that most of you ask them what they learned. They all think that their parents are paying attention when Pastor Steve preaches although one clarified by saying "My dad does have his ipad out during service, but it has the Bible on it." They also said they mostly paid attention during service too. Only one child said they didn't like to come to church.



Lots of them said their families do not read the Bible to-

gether regularly. Almost all of them said they never see their parents read their Bible outside of church (although some thought you might do that after they go to bed). Most of them say they do not read the Bible outside of church either.

Some quotes. What do you like most about church? "The food." "the playground." "the bulletins." "Sunday School." "Learning about God." What do you like least about coming to church? "Singing." "Catechism!!!" "Getting up early." "I get bornd in church." "Drying my hair in the morning." What happened after Jesus died? "He rose from the ded." "He got carried away." " I don't know." " He went to heven and sat on the right side of God." "The world chanched." " He went into the tomb and rose from the dead." "He desenended into hell " "He dessende into heaven."

I love your children. Remember, they notice what you do. You set the example now for what they will probably do one day as the spiritual leaders of their own families.

Cost is socks for OCC shoeboxes. Register your child by April 9. A nursery is provided.


Good Friday Service, April 18
