Last newsletter I shared some findings from a survey I did with your children, mostly 1st-6th graders. I will share a little more from the survey.

All but one child indicated they believe that all the Bible is true. They all said the Bible is mostly about Jesus or God. Shockingly about 1/4 of them do not think Satan is real. Most of them believe they will one day go to heaven, and all of them believe that Jesus really did die on the cross.

I asked them "How do we get to heaven?" Responses were "by letting Christ in our heart." "Die." "Die with a clean heart." "We do right." "Believe in God and believe that he died on the cross." "Accepting Jesus as our Savior."

I also asked them "Why did Jesus die on the cross?" Some of the responses were "He died on the cross to save us from our sins." "Because he loves us." "To save us from our sins so we would not have to sacrifice for our own sins."

All but one of them indicated that they learn more about God at church than they do at home. (Remember, if they come to church all the time, they may be here 5-6 hours a week; There are another 162 hours in a week full of teachable moments.) They also indicated that most of their parents do not practice catechism with them. However, some of them said you practice with them A LOT!

Again, they are learning **NOW** the foundation of their belief system. I cannot stress the importance of teaching them about God, reading the Bible, and talking about what the Bible teaches them in relation to what is going on around them (building that Biblical Worldview) everyday. Start early and stay faithful.
