What is something in your own life that God may be saying to you "lift up your eyes...look...see...go...walk (vs. 14-17)?

What subtle, but slippery, slope of sin do you see in the lifestyle of Lot?

In Chapter 14, what is the point of Abram's victory over the four kings? What part do alliances play?

Given the different way that Abram treats the king of Salem and the King of Sodom, what does that tell you about the character and faith of each?
