Curled up in my comfy chair, my thoughts drifted to "one silent night" over 2000 years ago. Dusk was falling as Mary and Joseph entered the little town of Bethlehem. Joseph had one thought in mind; finding a place where Mary could rest. He knew the long journey had taken a toll on her. Time was drawing near and her child was soon to be delivered.

The small town had swollen with visitors, all there to register and be counted in the census. Joseph had knocked on the door of several inns only to be turned away as they were already overflowing with weary travelers. In desperation he accepted a place in the stable offered them by an innkeeper. The reluctant, soon to be father, realized a roof over their heads was better than being in the elements for the night. The decision was a wise one as little time elapsed before the Christ Child made his appearance before dawn.
