The Potter's Choice

This word came from the Lord: "Go down to the potter's house...so I went down...I saw him working at the wheel. But the pot he was shaping was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him." Jeremiah 18:2-4

While living in Waco, I loved to visit a village nearby and watch the potter at work forming all kinds of vessels. Sometimes she would take the vessel from the wheel, wad it up, pound it a few times and place it back on the wheel. Once, I asked her why she did that. She responded that the clay had some bubbles in it and she must remove them so the vessel could stand the heat of the kiln.

Sometimes we need the same treatment from our Father. In Romans 9 we read these words; "shall what is formed say to the one who formed it, 'why did you make me like this?' I have.

Over the past few months I have been learning lessons in the Potter's hand. Sometimes I question why this loneliness must be mine to bear right now. I wonder if He is looking the other way while I seem to be drowning in sorrow. I wonder why my questions are met with only silence. Then I find that the "bubbles" are bursting and being replaced with a stronger trust in the hands of Jesus. I am learning to surrender in that silence where He is restoring my soul and giving me the ability to wait on Him-especially when I don't understand.

It is then the silence breaks...He instructs me to "get up, go to church, and fellowship with other believers." He calls me to follow Him and to be a vessel fit for the Master's use.

He meets me with a call to pulpit supply on a Sunday for a Pastor friend. He calls me to perform a wedding and my patio becomes a sacred sanctuary to unite a man and woman and four children into a family. He places me in a place where I minister to a family member who seems to be losing his way. In the night I feel Chalmer's encouragement. (Yes, for real.)

An amazing surprise summer shower comes while I'm on my porch swing. As dark rain clouds give way to pockets of blue, healing tears flow and the burden of my heart rolls away. The love of Jesus lifts me and I know my service belongs to Him. In excitement I wait for my next meeting with Jesus!
