

Sharing Social Ministry for July



The Interfaith Council is a collection of 108 congregations, monasteries and retreat centers that work together to make Contra Costa County a place where faith and service matter. Membership and affiliation comes from a wide range of Christian and other faith traditions, including Jewish, Buddhist, Baha'i, Unitarian, Islamic, Hindu, New Thought, Sikh, Sufi, Unity, Latter-Day Saints, and Religious Science.

Program areas include the Singing Messengers (which Lisa Farnitano accompanies, providing music to over 60 Nurs-

"When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. 
