This framework will soon be a duplex containing a three bedroom unit (flat) and a one bedroom unit that is wheelchair approved. To the far left of the framing near the fence, there will be a courtyard, garden, and tables. Parking spaces will run along the front edge of the property, from left to right, running parallel to the footpath.
