Decision-Making

1. Joshua called the Israelites to make a decision. Josh. 24:14–27. Josh. 24:14–15. "Now therefore, fear the Lord, serve Him in sincerity and in truth, and put away the gods which your fathers served on the other side of the River and in Egypt. Serve the Lord! And if it seems evil to you to serve the Lord, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

2. Elijah called God's people to stop wavering. 1 Kings 18:16–39. 1 Kings 18:21. And Elijah came to all the people, and said, "How long will you falter between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow him." But the people answered him not a word.

3. Today, if you hear his voice, don't harden your hearts (a warning against unbelief and rebellion).
Heb. 3:7–11. Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says:
"Today, if you will hear His voice, Do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, In the day of trial in

the wilderness, Where your fathers tested Me, tried Me, And saw My works forty years. Therefore I was angry with that generation, And said, 'They always go astray in their heart, And they have not known My ways.' So I swore in My wrath, 'They shall not enter My rest.' "

4. Moses' decision is a good example to follow. Heb. 11:24–26. By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward.

5. Make a full commitment. Rom. 12:1–2. |

beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.
