First, a word of thanks. What a great celebration we had on Labor Day weekend! The celebration of the 25th Anniversary of Ordination was very heartening. Britt and I feel blessed to be part of the Bethlehem community of faith and to participate in this community's journey of common worship and ministry.

Secondly, I hope you will consider participating in the various faith formation opportunities available for children, youth and adults. See the activities described in these pages and check out the brochures on the welcome table. I want to particularly

mention the *Evening Service of Meditation, Prayer and Peace*. This service now takes place on the second and fourth Sunday of each month. Much of the music comes from the Taize' tradition and includes prayer around the cross. Many describe this service as a welcome oasis of reflection and prayer.

Finally, this is the month we celebrate Generosity Sunday. This annual event and the weeks preceding it are opportunity for you to grow at least one step in your giving to God. One of the distinguishing marks of Christian spirituality is that such practices are never ends in themselves but somehow lead to love of neighbor and ministry to the world. That's how I like to think of our giving to God. Generosity is a spiritual practice. It is a mark of discipleship and an expression of our gratitude and worship.

Kibungo, Rwanda Update: Women's Ministry

In a continuing series of updates from our sister parish in Kibungo, this month's focus is on the women of the Kibungo. During Gerard's July 31, 2011 visit he provided Bethlehem Lutheran with a Power-Point presentation which included a summary on the Kibungo Women's ministry. In that summary six women gather once a month and identify social challenges facing their members, which include men, women and children in their community. This ministry visits at least one outside family in need and gives those identified small basic needs, like a kilo of sugar, a bar of soap and a packet of salt. All of this outreach is designed to build trust, friendship with the underlying hope that in the end they will seriously consider the Lutheran faith.

Gerard stressed the importance of this ministry and the need for additional funds to support the Women's ministry efforts in Kibungo. Our very own Donna Larson was asked how to deal with this issue, and lo and behold, Donna came up with an idea. Donna suggested that Bethlehem Lutheran could possibly help raise funds for this ministry by selling banana fiber cards made by the Kibungo women. These cards are like the ones that Gerard handed out during the services (*see picture below*). The women of the Kibungo parish thought this was a wonderful idea.



The Kibungo women pictured at their meeting are discussing the making of their banana fiber cards and sending them to be sold at Bethlehem Lutheran. A donation of \$100.00 from Bethlehem's Women's ministry was sent to Kibungo to help fund this project. We are hoping the first batch of cards arrive in time for our annual Women's Bake and Crafts Sale being held November 12th and 13th. Many members believe this is a great way to support the Kibungo Woman's Ministry and to provide our sister parish with self-sustaining endeavors. Yarn, knitting needles and instructions books on how to knit were also sent.

DISASTERS, FLOODS, FIRES, AND FEAR...BEING PREPARED FOR THINGS UNFORSEEN

There has been a monkey on my back ever since deciding to take this position as Faith Community Nurse for Bethlehem Lutheran Church. A lack of safety practices in our church is missing. I worry about our church family in case of a fire or need to evacuate the building rapidly. The monkey, or maybe it is God's Spirit, talks to me at times such

as the latest event in Lincoln, the Auburn fire last year and a more familiar setting, the lack of organized action seen in our church when the smoke alarm goes off. The voice comes along with memories; seeing results of burned children or panicked adults in the emergency rooms at which I have worked. It sometimes speaks to me at the most unexpected times....and never seems to go away. It tells me to get busy and develop a plan to save as many people as possible in an emergency.

In Romans we read God has a plan for us. It may not be a directive as to which door to exit out of if there is a fire in the church, but it is a plan to give us the wisdom to keep ourselves safe while we live on this planet which challenges us in many **unexpected** ways.

We have taken the monkey by the tail, or better yet, have heeded God's call to service, and formed a small Bethlehem Emergency/Disaster ministry which is working on developing guidelines for our BLC family. The American Red Cross has a great pamphlet, "5 Actions for Emergency Preparedness" which will guide us. You will be informed of the plan through the newsletter as well as in small groups that are currently meeting throughout the congregation's programs.

God's plan for us is to live in the comfort of knowing God will take care of us. Earthly things give us challenges that we can try to prepare for by heeding God's call to be diligent and to learn about safety and good health. Watch for more information coming your

way about this important part of the work of the church.

This ministry has also decided to offer our church as a collection or drop off center for needed items in case of a community wide disaster. If you would like to volunteer to be on the action team for this service, please contact Randi Olson through the church office.

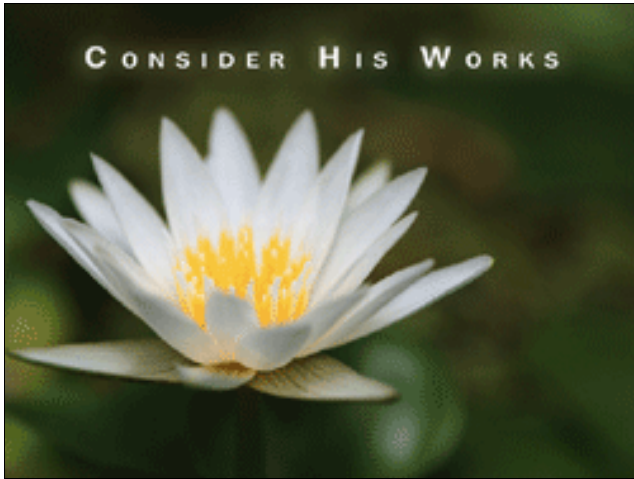

Philip C.L. Gray. Writes *A steward is someone who handles affairs for someone else. In ancient kingdoms, stewards ran the country in the absence of the king. Upon the king's return, the steward gave a full accounting for his actions. Even when the king was present, the steward often handled the daily affairs of the kingdom. However, a steward did not own the kingdom, and, the king determined when and how long a steward would serve him.*

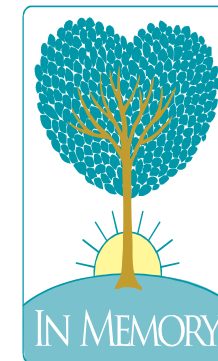
