Planting the Seeds of Faith

In this series of letters on "what a follower of Christ takes on to grow as his disciple", we have looked at the practice of daily prayer & devotion/Bible reading. This month we will look at the importance of attending small groups. I define a small group as a group that meets at least every other week & is focused on developing our faith in Jesus Christ, as well as looking for & finding ways of applying that faith in our lives. These types of small groups can come in many different forms; it can be a study group that looks at Scripture or a specific topic, it can be a choir, it can be an activity group, it can be a service group, it can be mission group. It can be any group of people that meet together in which there is an intentional, focused period of time in which the group looks at developing our faith in Jesus Christ as well as looking for & finding ways of applying that faith in our lives.

Now that the definition is out of the way, the question remains, why should people be part of small groups?

Reason one: Small groups are a way that the Holy Spirit works within us to mature us in Christ. The theological word for that is *sanctification* which means that our faith has purpose, a reason, & a task. This happens in a small group because we encounter God's word & grace though other people & this, in turn, helps us to see what we are missing or have been misinformed about in our own faith lives.

Reason two: A small group provides a place where we can be among people whom respect, care for, & pray for us, & that in turn, we respect, care for, & pray for them. A small group is ultimately the place where true Christian community is formed, maintained, & expressed.

I would like to touch upon some of the reasons why people don't join small groups, & offer a different perspective.

Some people hesitate joining a small group because they feel as if they don't know scripture well enough or don't know the correct religious terms to use. The reality is, it *does* take courage to overcome these feelings & truthfully, everyone has something to learn. If this is your reason for not joining a small group, the question I have for you is, are you willing to feel this temporary discomfort for a feeling of permanent confidence?

Another reason why people hesitate to join a small group is they feel as if they don't have the time; their lives are just too busy to fit in one more "activity." They think the day will come when they will have enough time to be part of a small group so they "put it off". The reality is you will never find the time unless you *make* the time. So, if developing your faith is important to you then you will just have to make the time.

While there are many more reasons why people don't join in small groups, one last reason I want to mention is, the thought because you have been involved in small groups before you don't need to do that anymore. In reality, very few, if any of us, will be made perfect in love in this lifetime & are fully mature in their faith. I think we all are in need God's maturing grace &, I would argue that, if you think you are full matured in your faith then you are just the person who others could learn from in a small group experience!

Being a disciple of Jesus Christ is about the journey that we are on as we follow the one who we call Lord. By engaging in small groups, the Holy Spirit helps us to be transformed more into the likeness of our Lord, & isn't that what being a disciple is all about? I invite you join or start a small group so that you may experience the transforming power of the Holy Spirit!




