From Your Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

For the past several years, I've taken some time for continuing education with three reading days in early January after the rush of the holidays. Thanks to Pam Lowe and Bob McCleave for a place on the Yellowstone River that is very peaceful, reflective, and perfect for such an occasion—just the dog and me. One of the books that I've been reading that has given me great insight is Arland Jacobson and Roy Oswald's, *The Emotional Intelligence of Jesus*. Pastor Oswald is an ordained Lutheran pastor who has made a career out of writing and teaching continuing education courses for mainline Protestant clergy. Our staff has studied with Pastor Oswald on a couple of different occasions.



Many of us are familiar with the term IQ, the measure of someone's intellectual or academic intelligence. The reading I have been doing suggests that emotional intelligence may be even more important to human flourishing, and especially faith communities.

Emotional intelligence is defined as *perceiving*, controlling, and evaluating emotions to better connect with others. The authors identify five key principles of emotional intelligence: *self-awareness*, empathy, assertiveness, optimism, and stress resilience.

Beginning on February 19, I will be leading a series of forums on the emotional intelligence. An adult forum will be dedicated to each of these five principles. We will also dedicate two forums to

loving one's enemies and forgiveness, two of the most challenging concepts that Jesus emphasizes. The forums will involve Bible study as we look at stories from Jesus' life that illustrates how he was emotionally intelligent.

Join us as we read Scripture together, enter into the stories of Jesus, and learn more about how it was that this carpenter from Nazareth interacted with people and is still so influential in today's world.


