Pastor's Letter

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past year, we've been celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. These celebrations are not only happening in the church. This past month, the Billings Symphony Chorale gave a concert called *Luther's Legacy*. This concert celebrated Luther's love of music, a tradition that continues in Lutheran churches and colleges to this day. As well as all his theological writing, Luther composed hymns, both the music and the words. One of them is a Christmas hymn called *From Heaven Above*, 268 in our hymnal. As the hymn has 14 verses, I will share with you only three of them. In these verses, he speaks of the hope of the Christ child:

From heav'n above to earth I come To bear good news to ev'ry home! Glad tidings of great joy I bring To all the world, and gladly sing

My heart for very joy now leaps; my voice no longer silence keeps; I too must sing with joyful tongue The sweetest ancient cradle song

Glory to God in the highest heav'n, Who unto us the Son has giv'n. With angels sing in pious mirth A glad new year to all the earth!

If you are ever looking to a good way to do devotions, pick up a hymnal and just read the words

Financial Update


The balance on the line of credit borrowed from the bank at the end of October was \$7,157.


Year-to-date, net loss of \$(14,883) is behind budget and \$10,223 ahead of last year through October.

For future giving, simply send a text with the amount and word you wish to give, and it will process automatically! It's as simple as that.
