Pastor's Letter

Dear ALC,

"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." Good news from the Gospel of John, the gospel that will guide our Sunday morning readings for the months to come. John is unique gospel, the other three are paired together as the "Synoptics" meaning they share stories and timelines of the life of Jesus. The Gospel of John is more of a loner- no birth narrative, no parables, no Sermon on the mount. Instead he focuses on the spiritual side of Christ and a number of "I am" statements. Join us for worship and hear about this different side of our Savior.

A few notes about life together:

Two-thirds of our skylights are installed. The weather turned before the crew could place the last skylight. As soon as conditions improve, that last bay will be placed and the project completed! We continue to accept donations towards covering the cost of the skylights and pledges to do so can be made on our website amluth.org

With the turn of the new year, we have reached the end of our agreement with Jen Potts to oversee the 11am Praise Team. In December the council came up with a list of possible members for a new worship and music director search team. Those people are being contacted now and the final team will be approved by council at their meeting on January 16th. The team will be shared with the congregation at the congregational meeting at the end of the month. We know transition can lead to anxiety but trust the work of the congregation and appointed committees to lead us into the future well.

And now to end with the Gospel of John, the final verse captures the continuing work of the church and the promise of the Spirit's presence among us today, "But there are many other things that Jesus did; if every one of them were written down, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written."

Stewardship Matters: Being Christian by Sharing

On Gratitude Sunday in November, Pastor Elizabeth eloquently demonstrated the concept of sharing by lighting a single candle during the children's sermon and then sharing the flame with others in the sanctuary. She asked the kids if her light was any less because she had given it away. The looks on their faces were priceless – the light stayed the same! One child observed that the flame had actually grown larger as it was shared.



When gifts are shared, rarely do we find ourselves with diminished return. Loving

more people does not mean that there is less love to go around. Sharing our abilities does not diminish the amount of talent we have. Sure, giving up half of the candy bar or piece of cake means you have less, but in reality you come out ahead by not eating all of those calories!

The sharing of financial resources is no different. Give and you shall receive is likely one of the most used (and over used) Biblical adages, but it works. Yet for many, giving away money creates great anxiety. Deep down we know it's true that we will never go without when we share our money, yet we just can't help feeling fearful rather than joy-filled by the act of sharing.

Sharing generously creates more generosity in our lives. The reason we share is not about the return; it is in response to God's generous gift of grace and love to us. As we move beyond celebrating the gift of love born to us in the manger to the season of Epiphany, let us be mindful that in being the Light of Christ in the world means we are called to share.
