Pastor's Letter

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Now the Lord said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing."

At this year's Pre-Annual Meeting Meeting, I spoke of religious scholar Phyllis Tickle's theory that every 500 years the church has a rummage sale, defined as ridding ourselves of all those practices, beliefs and ways of being that are no longer effective and get in the way of being the church we are called to be. At our meeting, I handed out a set of questions entitled New Questions for a New Day, questions that are an example of this rummage sale. One of the old questions was, What's our vision and how do we implement it? A new and better question reads, What's God up to and how do we get on board?



Our Strategic Planning process is an example of asking this new question. You may have expected this process to end with several bullet points identifying goals under the different ministry areas

that were identified in the process, a way of answering the old question, What's our vision and how do we implement it? I know that I certainly did! But our Strategic Planning group ended in a very different place, a place of living into the questions instead of putting forth answers, a place of asking the new question, What's God up to and how do we get on board? The following year will be marked with congregational-wide Bible study on Genesis 12, intentional worship and sermon series, and conversations about being kindred.

I invite you to read those pages in our *Annual Report* dedicated to our Strategic Planning process. They represent a good summary of the work of the past

year. The following statement is taken from that summary, and it captures the hopefulness and the energy of moving forward with this process: We are God's people, "kindred," called to take chances, and go where God will lead us even if we can't see that place, and to do so that we might be a blessing. If we work out of that understanding, decisions about the future of welcome, mission, communication, and worship are all shaped by that—being God's people so that we might be a blessing.

Worship: 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. Coffee, treats, and fellowship between services.




Stewardship Matters: It's about Love

Is there a word that has more definitions or carries more weight than the word LOVE? The word even has its own holiday - Valentine's Day - along with a dedicated symbol, the heart.

Stewardship is all about love. It's a culture, a mindset and a discipline centered around the way we use all of the resources that God has entrusted to our care so that we can love God and our neighbor. The practice of stewardship has its own symbol, too – the

cross.



God makes the first vertical line DOWN. Stewardship begins at creation, where God first comes down to us. We are first receivers of God's love, not givers. We are claimed by God in baptism; we belong to God and all that we have belongs to God.

Next, God's faithful people follow by moving IN to the center, responding with gratitude to the grace freely given. When we realize that all we have belongs to God and not to us, we can't help but give it away in thanksgiving for God's generosity to us. Finally, we look OUT to our neighbors on either side, both near and far, to see how God is calling us to love our neighbor with all that God has entrusted to our care. We are a church that believes Jesus is God's blessing to us. Our lives can be a blessing to others: we are called to love, not just with our words but with our whole lives transforming God's

commandment to "love our neighbors as ourselves" from a religious

expression into a way of life. Stewardship is love!


