

Stewardship Matters: Cracking the Code

Code words are curious. The words themselves stand for something else and are meant to convey a disguised or tongue-in-cheek message. Code words sometimes have double or misinterpreted meanings: LOL can mean Laughing Out Loud, Lots of Love, or Little Old Lady. And anyone who has lived in the American South knows that "Bless Your Heart" can be uttered in two completely different contexts. Understanding the context is the key to deciphering the code.

Churches have code words, too, and stewardship is one of those words. In its best interpretation, stewardship means "we recognize God's gifts of abundance." More commonly, however, stewardship means "we want your money." Why is that? When viewed through the lens of consumerism - material possessions, extracurricular activities, wealth accumulation - it sure would seem that the church is standing in line to get into our wallets. We hear the word stewardship and immediately jump to the belief that "the church" thinks we should manage ourselves and our money differently.

Perhaps stewardship cynicism stems from the timing of stewardship messages. After all, aren't most stewardship conversations relegated to the Fall season, timed to coincide with the annual



budgeting process? How convenient.

Faithful stewards think differently. They know that looking inward through the lens of God's abundance is the more fitting way to approach stewardship. Our response to that abundance is then reflected in our giving which allows us to look outward in service to others, answering the call to be Christian. No codes, no hidden messages.

At ALC, being Christian means that we are *kindred*, going where God leads us in order to be a blessing to

others. We will accomplish this journey when, individually, our stewardship equation is in balance: Stewardship = Time + Talent + Money. ALC is a family of faithful stewards! Next month we'll crack the stewardship code further by exploring our congregational trends in the giving equation. Until then, you are invited to consider your own application of the stewardship code.
