Healing Lessons!

I'm not a surgeon and I have never received any formal Medical Training. My first influence of a Doctor on my life was from Dr. Gillespie when I was 4 or 5 I fell off of a chain length fence while throwing dirt clods at some kids and had to have my finger sewed up and on! I wanted to be a Doctor after that! I've received stiches toes to head during my life and have received care for physical and emotional injuries.

Recently, I experienced what can happen when you try and pull a Brodhead out of an archery target improperly. My son Michael was with me and after the bleeding stopped we engaged our medical training with a swift coat of superglue! It kept the blood from going all over and made it look like nothing was wrong!

Following a couple of days I noticed that it appeared that the healing was happening on the outside but was still pretty sore on the inside. Like Emotional healing physical healing needs to be accomplished from the inside out. Sometimes we get in a hurry and just want the outside to look like nothing is wrong but the infection suggests otherwise.

I continue to learn that all the superglue in the world won't

allow the pain of loss and stress injury to go away. It takes time and a concerted effort to allow the healing to begin on the inside.

Walking with our First responders illuminates the many stress injuries that we can experience.

My prayer is that we all will experience the opportunity for self-care so that we can heal from the inside out. Don't forget your superglue!

Hospital and Home Visits – to assist in healing and support ministry.

Providing Critical Incident Debriefing and Defusing –
following a critical incident or
traumatic event, for officers,
emergency services personnel,
and the community.

Officer Training and Public Awareness – to help the officer and emergency services personnel and their family members maintain healthy relationships to enhance their careers.

Training – we offer monthly training and specialized training to our chaplains and to the emergency service personnel of our communities.

Ride-alongs – with officers and emergency services personnel, encouraging and establishing trust, identifying with their daily pressures and responsibilities.

Officiating Services – celebrating with officers and emergency services personnel and their families in Wedding Celebrations, Vow Renewals, and Baby Dedications. Providing pre- and post-marriage counseling and officiating at funeral services, for officers, emergency services personnel, and our communities.

Search & Rescue – Chaplains are there to assist the Search & Rescue teams as they are called upon for missions, rescues, searches, evacuations, and recoveries.



Disaster Services – a number of our chaplains have assisted with events across the country.

Confidential and Personal Counseling – to police officers and emergency services personnel, their families and the community.

Critical Incident Stress Managment – our Chaplains provide a wide range of services helping others deal with traumatic incidents.
