Thank you for your support of Central Oregon Public Safety Chaplaincy! Because of your help, we are able to continue the service offered to the First Responders and community.

This past year our chaplains have responded to **hundreds of calls** including deaths, suicides, fatal crashes, fires, homicides, drownings and death notifications. They spent **thousands of hours on call**, visiting First Responders at their departments and offices, doing ride-alongs, and just being there. **They offer on-site crisis intervention and support** to First Responders and victims of traumatic events. We currently have two staff and 20 volunteer chaplains who respond when dispatched.

This year noted the retirement of our long time COPC Executive Chaplain Jim Crowley. After 16 years of service and leading the process to start COPC from the beginning, Jim was able to join his wife Brenda in retirement.

The COPC Board of Directors appointed Mike Dismore to be the new executive chaplain. Mike has served COPC for 15 years and we look forward to his leadership and caring for COPC.

Joel Stutzman was hired prior to Chaplain Crowley's retirement as part of our succession plan. Joel is now serving as the assistant chaplain and we are very pleased that he is on the team.
