The Butterfly Effect

Jesus said,


But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. - Acts 1:8

The Butterfly Effect is an idea that some mathematicians use to explain a theory of how a small change can have a huge, uncontrollable effect. A butterfly's flapping wings could generate enough energy to affect the air flow around the insect which, in turn, could affect a larger air mass and then an even bigger one until you've got a full-blown hurricane! Think of a tiny snowball as it starts rolling down a mountainside. It gathers both speed and mass as more snow sticks to the ball until there's an avalanche! That's the Butterfly Effect, and it's mirrored in our stewardship outreach theme for 2014: "Creating Ripples: Growing in Faith, Reaching Out in Love."

As Christians, we're called to make some ripples which could turn into waves – even a tsunami! The ripples that are created by our responses to God's good generosity are many. Great News to Report!

The food we packed at the Feed My Starving Children Fox Cities MobilePack in July has arrived at partner organizations in three different parts of the world! The 1008 boxes of food – feeding 596 kids a healthy meal a day for an entire year – were sent in three shipments to FMSC partners who will distribute the food to those who need it the most.

- 468 boxes (101,088 meals) shipped to Haiti through FMSC partner Mission of Hope. Mission of Hope's primary efforts are focused on Church advancement, educational development, orphan care, health care, nutrition and HaitiOne Network. Their passion is to see the hopeless find hope through Jesus Christ, and empower future generations through education to bring their country out of poverty. www.mohhaiti.org
- 432 boxes (93,312 meals) shipped to Nicaragua through FMSC partner Food for the Poor. Food for the Poor helps provide food, housing, health care, education, water projects, emergency relief, and micro-enterprise assistance in the Caribbean and Latin America. www.foodforthe poor.org
- 108 boxes (23,328 meals) shipped to Cambodia through FMSC partner Reach Now International. Reach Now International seeks to reach the devastated and desperate with the Gospel and practical help, targeting orphans, refugees, internally displaced people, those affected by war, governmental situations, poverty, persecution, and other natural conditions and calamities. www.reachnow.net

Lutheran World Relief Quilts and Kits

The quilts were made by the quilting group at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. A total of 244 quilts were made by the ladies this year. Of these quilts, 194 will be shipped to a Lutheran World Relief warehouse to be distributed wherever they are needed. Most often recipients use their LWR Quilts to shield against the cold and rain, but their versatility also makes them useful as simple tents, floor coverings, or a wrap to hold a baby on his mother's back. The other 50 quilts have been distributed locally earlier this year, because of their need to:

- Casa Clare
- Emergency Shelter
- Red Cross
- Harbor House
- Lutheran Social Services

Lutheran World Relief Kits are made by members donating items, money, sewing diapers, blankets and school backpacks. We have material for making diapers, receiving blankets and backpacks in a cabinet to your right in the room behind the library. If you can help sew, please take some of the material. Just a reminder that these are ongoing projects and we start collecting now for the items that will be shipped next year. **A big thank you to our Sunday School students for choosing LWR school kits as their fall project.** This is a great contribution to help kids in need.

Quilters meet in the Community Room on Wednesdays at 9:00 a.m. until noon. Workers are needed to help on Wednesdays with cutting squares, ironing fabrics, sewing fabric together and tying quilts. If you cannot be there on Wednesdays but would like to help, you can sew the quilt squares together in your home at your convenience. Printed instructions are in the quilting closet.

Also needed are new or gently used cotton or cotton blend fabrics and corduroy (no stretch material, please). Monetary donations are always welcome. The local quilts need new batting and new material and these can be quite costly. Edward Benedict presented a video presentation of his stay with Kopano

Lutheran Church congregants at the September Global Mission Team Meeting. The people of Kopano Lutheran Church in Mogwase, South Africa were unbelievable hosts. They accepted Ed unconditionally into their church, homes, and lives. For many, he was the first white person staying at their home, and for a people crushed for years under the yoke of Apartheid, this act of welcoming is remarkable. The video took us inside the church on Sunday morning to hear hymns sung by the congregation and anthems by the church choirs.

Many of the church organizations were featured in the film as they took Ed on many adventures. He toured a village, climbed a small mountain with the youth, visited an Afrikaans' ranch, and survived a shopping trip led by three women. Also, the video gave us a glimpse of the surrounding countryside: game preserves, the Sun City Resort, and platinum mines. These provide good jobs and income so that people can build modern homes with all the amenities.

Attributes, Journaling, Praying, What??

We have a member at Prince of Peace who loves to journal on her faith journey and spiritual insights. The following is an example of how you can get started in your faith by journaling.

Read Galatians 5:22-23 "But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

Make a list of attributes listed in Galatians 5:22-23. Beside each attribute, write the name of someone who needs you to live that quality in his or her life. A few examples below are to help you get started:

Love: Jodi – my neighbor who is struggling with her son and his addiction.

Joy: Kathy – my friend who has just discovered she has cancer.

Peace: Erika – my sister who is going through a divorce.

Make a specific plan for meeting each need. (I will take Jodi to lunch.) Put a time limit on it. (I will take Jodi to lunch on Thursday.)

Record your experience in your journal. Pray for the individual or families throughout their trials and triumphs.
