Putting Faith into Action

Homework?!

In my last couple of sermons, I have tried to give out "homework" for everyone (including myself) to do for the week. It has been fun as some have picked up on this challenge and engaged the community around us. The first challenge was to ask someone that you don't know if you could pray for them. The second challenge was to be praying to God, asking the Holy Spirit to lead you to someone who needs comfort in their life and to offer them comfort. So, why have homework like this at the end of a sermon? Honestly, I need a constant reminder to not just have faith, but to put my faith into action. In other words, when I gave my life to Jesus, it wasn't just a gift for me to hold onto but a gift to share with others.

The Social Justice Gospel

The caution with this type of action is that I don't want it to be labeled a "social justice gospel." Those who are critics of a social justice gospel don't believe that Christians should be taking care of everyone's needs. The most important need for humanity is eternal salvation, to which I agree. However, as the number of "nones" (those having no religious affiliation) continues to rise, one of the reasons given for their disengagement from Christianity is that they hear plenty about faith in action but don't see it lived out. This simply cannot be. It is crucial that our church buildings never become a social gathering of people who have all life figured out. I, personally, never want to feel as if I have arrived in my faith but want to continue to grow in it and be challenged. Meeting hurts and needs in our community and offering the hope of Jesus is what I want to be pursing. Why???

For the Least of These

Jesus told His disciples a parable in Matthew 25:31-46 that points out that those who follow Him must put their faith into action. Sit down tonight by yourself or with your family and read these verses aloud and think about them. If you have children present, don't lead them, but simply ask them what they think Jesus is telling his followers to do in this parable. I'd love to hear their response. The evidence is overwhelming in this parable that we cannot just worship God and ignore the hurts and needs of the community around us. We can have excellent Bible studies, times of singing, sermons, prayers, but if we become complacent in our walk then we are in danger of missing the point. So, I continue to challenge myself, and you, to take the words of Jesus seriously and live them out. It will be difficult at times, it will be scary, and it will definitely be inconvenient, but it will all be worth it!


