



On Thursday, September 9, 1926, Edward Small, to Winnie Bell Abrams in Greensboro County, Alabama. Born into humble beginnings; at the age of nine Edward accepted Christ as his personal Savior at Springfield Baptist Church under Rev. P.W. Wooders.

At the age of 14, Edward Small had to work the fields in his home town and attended Hail County Public Schools. In order to help and support his family, he left school at the age of 16 and began to work fulltime. At the age of 17, he moved to Birmingham and found work at U.S. Steel.

In 1943, he met his soul mate, Tereatha Turner at New Jerusalem Baptist Church in Greensboro, AL, where she was drawing from the well. A year later, they reunited while he was visiting friends in Bessemer, Alabama. The couple were united in Holy Matrimony on February 25, 1945. During its 61 years, this union was blessed with four sons: Charles Edward (deceased), Carl Perry, Anthony Loren and Michael Dwayne; and two daughters: Carol Yvonne and Sharon Theresa.

Edward and Tereatha moved to Detroit, Michigan until after the Second World War had ended. Edward Small moved back to Alabama and resided in Bessemer where he worked as a Coal Miner until 1950. That same year he became a member of Old Saint Paul Baptist Church, where he became a Sunday School Teacher and trained to be a Deacon. Edward Small sang with several gospel groups that left a lasting impression in the churches of Bessemer Alabama.

In 1951 Edward moved back to Detroit, MI and joined the Russell Street Baptist Church teaching in its Sunday school and serving on the Deacons Board. Then joined Community Baptist Church where he did the same, and became president of the Gospel Choir. He also sang with the Wiley Gospel Singers.

n 1952, Deacon Edward Small moved his family to Cleveland, Ohio. Edward became a Deacon at The Calvary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor Bivins. During this same year (1952) Edward accepted his calling into the Ministry.

Edward enrolled in Cleveland Public Schools System to complete his education.

Edward received his High school diploma at the Training School in Cleveland, Ohio.

He later attended Baptist Bible College. Rev. Edward Small's diverse educational background involved attending Ashland College and Case Western Reserve University, where he received diplomas.

In 1956, being led by the Holy Spirit and under a collective counsel, by the grace of God, Starlight Missionary Baptist Church was founded. Minister Edward Small was appointed to take leadership and become the First Pastor of Starlight Baptist Church.

On January 8, 1956, Second Sunday, the doors were open and the first service was held at 8919 Superior Avenue. The congregation outgrew that location and moved to 997 Lakeview Rd. God continued to bless his ministry and the church outgrew that location and moved to East Cleveland, Ohio.

During his tenure as the Pastor of Starlight Baptist Church Rev. Dr. Ed. Small achieved great things, including, but not limited to: serving as the Moderator of The Union District Association for (30) Years, appointed as moderator for the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. Under the Late President, Dr. T.J. Jemison, where He served for 10 Years. Pastor Small attributed his accomplishments to God and his supportive and understanding wife, Tereatha.

To this day, by the Lords divine will, Starlight remains an indelible shining beacon of light in the education of God's written word. It will continue its mission of dedication to bringing Gods children to salvation.

He leaves to cherish his memories and carry on his legacy: three sons Rev. Carl Perry (Sylvia), Rev. Anthony Loren (Carol), and Rev. Michael Dwayne (Sandra); two daughters Carol Yvonne Small Robinson and Sharon Teresa; daughter-in-law: Ladelle V. Small; He also leaves Brothers and Sisters James T. Abrams, Jr., Lenard E. Abrams, William Andrew Banks, Sr., Veronica Barnes, Mary Jackson, Chester Webb, Herman Webb, and Edna D. Williams; 19 grandchildren; 25 great-grandchildren special care-giver: Barbara J. Williams; cousin: Louise (Alabama); a host nieces, nephews, extended family and friends.
