Day 1, Wed Nov 01 – DEPARTURE

Day 2, Thu Nov 02 – Arrival in Israel, Tel Aviv, Netanya

"I rejoiced with those who said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD.'" (Psalm 122:1).

We arrive at Ben Gurion Airport where we are met and assisted with transfer to our hotel in Netanya on the beautiful Mediterranean Sea. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Overnight Tel Aviv/Netanya area: Leonardo Art Hotel/similar (D)



Day 3, Fri Nov 03 – Jaffa, Caesarea, Nazareth, Sea of Galilee

"The angel said, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. For nothing is impossible with God.' 'I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. 'May it be to me as you have said.' Then the angel left her. (Luke 1:35-38)

Early departure this morning as we first visit Jaffa where Peter had a vision that led him to convert Cornelius (Acts 10) and initiate the church's mission to the Gentiles. Here too he revived the righteous woman Tabitha (Acts 9:36-40). We then follow in the footsteps of Paul as we make our way up the Plain of Sharon to Caesarea. We visit the ancient Herodian harbor, the remains of the seaside palace of Pontius Pilate and the theater. With the conversion of Cornelius by St. Paul (Acts 10), this impressive Roman city became the beachhead of the Christian mission to the Gentiles. We stroll through the walled Crusader city and drive out to the Roman aqueduct on the beach, where we can put our feet in the Mediterranean. Continue across the Valley of Jezreel and drive up to the Hill of Precipitation (Luke 4:14-28), where we will reflect on the Old Testament Biblical events Jesus would have seen from this precipice near Nazareth. We will point out the sites of the battle of the Waters of Megiddo, led by Deborah (Judges 4-5) and wonder at the courage and faith of this remarkable woman. We then drive down the hill to Nazareth Village where we will pray for Europe. The village is a reconstructed first-century village that tells the story of the hometown of Jesus. The



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homes, crafts and reenactments will help us appreciate the daily life and responsibilities of women of Jesus' day. We continue down to the Church of the Annunciation, where, according to tradition, the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary Passing through Cana (John 2), where at Mary's request, Jesus performed the first of his miracles, we arrive at our accommodations on the Sea of Galilee. Relax at the shore before dinner. Overnight at the Sea of Galilee for the next three nights.

Overnight Tiberias: Leonardo Club/similar (B/L/D)

Day 4, Sat Nov 04 – Sea of Galilee: Boat Ride with devotion and prayer for Asia on board, Mt. of Beatitudes, Tabgha, Caphernaum, Magdala

"Now when he saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven". (Matthew 5:1-3)

We begin our day boarding a wooden boat for Ginnosar –sailing in the footsteps of Jesus! Disembarking, we visit an original fishing boat of Jesus' day, recently discovered in the mud of the lake shore. We drive to the Mount of Beatitudes to reflect on the new commandment Jesus taught here. We then descend the hillside (twenty minutes by foot or by bus) to Tabgha (Heptapagon – Greek for seven springs), visiting the Church of Loaves and Fishes marking Jesus' miraculous feeding of the Five Thousand (Mark 6:30-44) as well as the Church of Mensa Christi, where, after the resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples on the lakeshore (John 21). After lunch (those who wish can savor "St. Peter's Fish" native to the Sea of Galilee), we continue to Caphernaum to see the house of Peter, where Jesus healed Peter's mother in law (Mark 1:29-31). We see the cramped living quarters of the ancient town and the basalt hand mills where women would grind grain together for their families' daily bread (Matthew 24:41), as well as the synagogue where Jesus preached and cast out demons (Mark 1). We drive south along the western shores of the Sea of Galilee to the exciting new discovery of a first century synagogue at Magdala where we can infer that Christ as an itinerant preacher would have preached in that synagogue.

Overnight Tiberias: Leonardo Club/similar (B/L/D)

Day 5, Sun Nov 05 – Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Gergesa, Worship Service

"When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets." "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:13-16).

This morning we head north through the lush Upper Jordan Valley to Dan. Here we combine a short nature walk with views of the ancient ruins, including the Israelite high place where King Jeroboam erected



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a golden calf (I Kings 12). Onward to the foothills of Mt. Hermon and the headwaters of the Jordan at Banias – Ceasarea Philippi, where Peter acknowledged Jesus as Messiah (Matthew 16:13-28). Stroll along the rushing waters and walk up to the cave and the remains of the pagan temples of Roman times. Looking out on the road to Damascus, we will be reminded of the conversion of Paul (Acts 9). We descend towards the eastern shores of the Sea of Galilee, to the remains of the church at Gergesa, where Jesus drove the evil spirits out of the possessed man into the swine (Matthew 8:28-34). This afternoon there will be a private worship service and **prayer for Africa**. We return to the hotel for a late afternoon swim or relaxation at the lakeshore. Those who wish may want to visit the diamond and jewelry factory in Tiberias after dinner.

Overnight Tiberias: Leonardo Club/similar (B/L/D)

Day 6, Mon Nov 06 – Tomb of Rachel the Poetess, Jordan River Baptismal site, Jericho, Masada, Good Samaritan Inn, Jerusalem

"I have not sung you, my country, not brought glory to your name with the great deeds of a hero or the spoils a battle yields. But on the shores of the Jordan my hands have planted a tree, and my feet have made a pathway through your fields. Modest are the gifts I bring you. I know this, mother. Modest, I know, the offerings of your daughter: Only an outburst of song on a day when the light flares up, Only a silent tear for your poverty"[2]. (Rachel the Poetess)

We begin our day with a devotion with an emphasis on the **Day of Prayer and prayer for the South West Pacific** at one of the most beautiful spots on the lakeside – the Tomb of Rachel the Poetess in the pioneer cemetery at Kinneret. We will read of the poems of Rachel, whose struggles with illness and unrequited love were strengthened by her attachment to the Bible and its landscape. We then head down the Jordan Valley to Jericho, the world's oldest city, climbing the Tel to view the ancient towers and the Mount of Temptation, marking Jesus' temptation by Satan in the wilderness. We pass by Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were written. Further south is the Nature Reserve of Ein Gedi.

"My lover is to me a cluster of henna blossoms from the vineyards of En Gedi." (Song of Solomon 1:14)

We then take a short nature walk at the oasis of Ein Gedi. See the ibex and conies (rabbits) and cool off under the rushing waterfall. Now we know why this place inspired Solomon when he "Say to the Daughter of Zion, 'See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'" (Matthew 21:5). We end our day at the impressive desert fortress of Masada where we will **pray for the Caribbean**. We ascend by cable car to view the palaces of Herod and the site of the Zealots' last stand against the Romans before we travel back up the Dead Sea coast and cross the Judean Desert to ascend the Judean Hills passing by the Good Samaritan Inn on our way to Jerusalem. Finally, on top of Mt. Scopus we behold majestic Jerusalem. We drive down into the city and check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Overnight Jerusalem: Leonardo Jerusalem/similar (B/L/D)



Day 7, Tue Nov 07 – Western (Wailing) Wall, Temple Mount, Shepherds' Field, Bethlehem

"I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. (Luke 2:10-11).

We begin at the Western (Wailing) Wall, remnant of the Temple in which Jesus preached and a sacred place of prayer for Jews from all over the world. If we are fortunate, we may see Bar Mitzvah services in progress! We continue to the Temple Mount, viewing the Dome of the Rock, built on the site of the Second Temple. Later this morning we head south into the Hills of Judea, passing by Rachel's Tomb (Genesis 35:19) on our way to the Shepherds' Fields where we will **pray for North America**. There we rejoice over the glad tidings of the birth of Jesus and remember the faith of Ruth who gathered grain in the fields of Boaz nearby. Her faithfulness and determination were rewarded and she became the ancestor of the Messiah. We will visit

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the Bethlehem Bible College, subject to confirmation. We go on to Bethlehem for lunch and to shop for the famous olive wood and mother-of-pearl crafts that have been produced by the Christians of Bethlehem for centuries. This afternoon, we visit the 5th-century Church of the Nativity and the altar of the manger. We then meet with Palestinian Christian women of Bethlehem and hear of their struggles to raise their families and maintain a Christian presence in Bethlehem today.

Overnight Jerusalem: Leonardo Jerusalem/similar (B/L/D)

Day 8, Wed Nov 08 - Mt of Olives, Garden of Gethsemane, Kidron Valley, Mount Zion, Church of the Dormition, Upper Room

Today we will start on the Mt. of Olives with the Old City tilted toward us. After an orientation, we descend the traditional Palm Sunday road to Dominus Flevit ("The Lord weeps"), remembering Jesus' entry (Luke 19). As we gaze out on the magnificent walls and domes, we reflect on Jesus' weeping over the city that has yet to know peace. Continue to the Garden of Gethsemane (Aramaic for 'oil press'), meditating on the sorrow of Jesus the night preceding his judgment – 'father let this cup pass from me, yet not my will but your will be done' (Luke 21). We will marvel at the gnarled ancient olive trees and gather for prayer in the garden remembering Latin America. We continue down through the Kidron Valley and drive up Mount Zion to the church grounds called Peter in Gallicantu, which affords the best view of early Jerusalem from the west. Here, the Assumptionist Fathers propose, was the house where the High Priest Caiaphas interrogated Jesus. We continue the day at the Church of the Dormition, whose beautiful mosaics depict the major heroines of faith of the Old and New Testaments. Conclude at the Upper Room, traditional site of the Last Supper.

This evening we gather for a gala Farewell Dinner at our hotel or local restaurant.

Day 9, Thu Nov 09 - Pools of Bethesda, Via Dolorosa, Holy Sepulcher, Garden Tomb, Free Time

"He has risen!" (Mark 16:6)

This morning we visit the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the man paralyzed for 38 years (John 5) and sing in the adjoining Crusader Church of St. Anne. Prepare your voices! Hymns never sounded this good! We then proceed up the Via Dolorosa to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Time for lunch on your own. We conclude with a communion celebration at Golgotha and the Garden Tomb. The tomb is empty! Indeed He is risen! Balance of the day at leisure with dinner and overnight at our hotel.

Overnight Jerusalem: Leonardo Jerusalem/similar (B/L/D)

Day 10, Fri Nov 10 – Return Home

We return home enriched with the blessings of the journey and ready to share our faith experiences with family and friends. Breakfast and departure transfers are provided. (B)

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in[a] the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20).

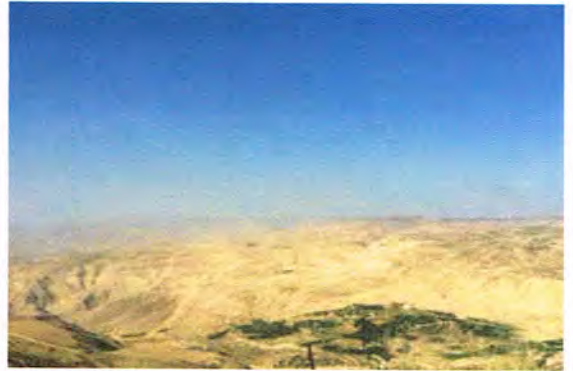

Day 10, Fri Nov 10 – Jerusalem, Allenby Bridge, Mt. Nebo, Madaba, Petra

This morning we drive to the border crossing at the Allenby Bridge, clear border formalities and pick up our Jordanian coach and guide. We continue to Mt. Nebo at an elevation of 3300 feet from where Moses viewed the Promised Land of Canaan – after the Lord said to him “This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said I will give it to your descendants.” Mount Nebo offers a spectacular view of the Promised Land as seen by Moses. On a clear day you can see the Dead Sea, the Jordan River Valley, Jericho, Bethlehem and the distant hills of Jerusalem. On the platform at the summit is a modern sculpture by an Italian artist representing Moses’ staff and Jesus’ words in John 3: “As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up.”



From there it is a short drive to Madaba where the remains of the oldest known map of the Holy Land, painstakingly assembled from more than a million pieces of colored stone and glass, lie on the floor of the Greek Orthodox Church of St. George. This unique art treasure was designed by an unknown artist and constructed in a Byzantine cathedral in the middle of the 6th century. It shows the entire region from Jordan and Palestine in the north to Egypt in the south. Madaba has a long history dating back before 1300B.C. In spite of some inaccuracies, it is regarded as the most exact map of the Holy Land before modern cartography was developed.



After lunch at a local restaurant, we'll take the Desert Highway and part of the King's Highway to Petra in the Land of Edom. Check into our hotel for dinner and overnight..

Overnight Petra: Moevenpick Petra/similar (B/L/D)

Day 11, Sat Nov 11 – Petra, Amman

Today especially, be sure to wear comfortable walking shoes, a hat and carry drinking water.

After breakfast at our hotel, we drive up to Petra in the heart of the Seir Mountains as mentioned in the Bible in Genesis. These mountains house the Aaron Peak, the burial place of Aaron, brother of Moses.

Petra, the world wonder, is without a doubt Jordan's most valuable treasure and greatest tourist attraction. The “Rose-red city that time forgot” was literally carved directly into the vibrant red, white and pink sandstone cliff faces by the Nabateans more than 2000 years ago and the prehistoric Jordan city of Petra was “lost” to the Western



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world for hundreds of years. Entrance to the city is through the Siq, a narrow gorge flanked on either side by soaring cliffs. The colors and formations of the rocks are dazzling. As you come through the Siq, you will catch your first glimpse of the Treasury, a massive façade carved in the early 1st century as the tomb of an important Nabatean king. (Many will remember the entrance and Treasury from the Hollywood blockbuster *Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade*. There are hundreds of elaborate rock-cut tombs with intricate carvings, a massive Roman-style theatre which could seat 3,000 people, obelisks, temples, sacrificial altars, colonnaded streets and high above via a flight of 800 rock cut steps, the impressive Ad-Deir Monastery.

After we have seen the Rose-red city of Petra, we will exit for lunch at a local restaurant. We then drive to Amman, the modern and ancient capital of Jordan, one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world. Amman was known in the Old Testament as Rabbath-Ammon, the capital of the Ammonites around 1200 BC. We will have a panoramic driving tour including the Citadel and Roman amphitheatre before checking into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

ACCOMMODATIONS/ROOMMATES/SINGLE SUPPLEMENTS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower.

Hotels categories are listed in your tour inclusions. Please note that air conditioning is not a standard amenity and may not be available in the room types that have been reserved for the group. Internet is not included in the hotel price and is an additional charge payable on site to the hotel.

Single rooms are subject to availability and at an additional cost. Please note that many single rooms have one twin bed and are small compared to rooms for two people. Should you wish to have a private room for the entire tour, this supplement will be added to your invoice.

Securing a roommate is each tour participant's individual responsibility. Travelink will provide you with names of others registered for your tour who desire a roommate. Should you not have a roommate at the time you register, you will be billed the single supplement. Once your roommate registers that charge will be credited.

MEALS: As specified in your itinerary: B = Breakfast, L = Lunch, D=Dinner. Coffee and tea included with breakfast only. All other beverages are extra.

SIGHTSEEING: As outlined in the itinerary, by private motor coach, the services of best available local qualified English-speaking guide and entrance fees.
