

Course No. 9013 • Introduction to Greek Rev. Burley Hudson, TX • Instructor 8:00 am • COBO Convention Center • 413B **Course Description:** This course introduces the serious student to Koine (common) Greek, the Greek of the New Testament. The students will learn the alphabet, some basic grammar, and the use of the Greek Lexicon. As a result of this study, the students will be able to recognize and translate terms found in commentaries. Likewise, after completing this course, the students will have the background to successfully master the study of Greek at a higher level of concentration. formation on Paul's letter to the Romans. The student will discuss the authorship, the approximate date of writing, and the recipients. As a result of this study the students will not only receive a strong introduction to the Doctrine of Salvation (the general theme of this letter), but they will also see the strongest systematic statement of faith in the Bible.
