Holy Communion with Zion Lutheran Church

By participating in Holy Communion...

... we acknowledge that we have sinned.

... we trust that Jesus is giving His true Body and Blood for the forgiveness of our sins.

... you are uniting yourself under the teaching and discipline of that church with which you are communing.

Perhaps you are not yet sure about what Zion and our sister churches stand for, or perhaps you have not yet received baptism. Still, we are truly glad to be with you today, and you are invited to fold your hands over your chest to indicate that you are receiving a blessing instead, but please talk with our pastor or with one of our elders after worship so that indeed we may receive Communion together soon.

As you receive Communion, know that the bread and wine have been prepared in as sanitary a manner as reasonably possible, leaving a space between individual cups to make room for you to take hold of your own cup.

The clear cups in the center of the trays indeed contain a drop of wine that is then diluted with grape juice. Alternatively, anyone who really needs to abstain from alcohol may receive only the Body of Christ at this time.

For now we are temporarily suspending the use of a common cup, though we look forward to restoring it when the time is right as it has been a treasured part of the Church's life that research has demonstrated to be quite sanitary.
