SII College Job Description for 2010.

Objectives:

- The Summer Intern Institute for college age students will provide a chance for an individual to learn ministry through hands on experience. In this internship the individual will assist in Church ministry under the supervision of the youth pastor. They will be challenged to grow in their spiritual, personal and professional goals as they serve in various ministries of North Mason Bible Church.

Responsibilities:

- Weekly Responsibilities during the 10 weeks of Summer June 14th – August 6th 2010:
- Under the leadership of the youth pastor, the intern will develop a list of goals for the summer intern experience. Together they will design work strategies to accomplish the intern's goals.
- The Intern will be expected to serve with the church a total of five hours a week.
 - Teaching a one-hour small group of middle school or high school students of the same gender under the supervision of the Youth Pastor.
 - Attend a weekly 2 hours class with one of the Pastors at North Mason Bible Church.
 - Involvement in a particular ministry related to the accomplishment of their internship goals and approved by the youth pastor.
- The intern will be responsible to keep a journal of the experiences and objectives achieved during his/her internship at North Mason Bible Church.

Supervision and Compensation:

- The Student Ministry Intern will report directly the youth pastor.
- The Intern will be invited and expected to attend two staff meetings with the Pastoral team of North Mason Bible Church during the summer.
- **The intern will be given \$500 scholarship money for 10 weeks of service upon completion of the 50 hours.**

Qualifications to Apply:

- Turn in application to Pastor James Owolabi no later than June 1st 2010.
- The intern will need to have completed at least one year of college.
- The intern should be teachable and open to learning new skill sets that will help them develop in ministry preparation.
- The intern should be supportive of church policy, pastors, and staff and regularly attend services at North Mason Bible Church.
- No criminal records of any kind (background checks will be done).
- A willingness to learn from mistakes, make changes and develop personal character.
- A commitment and appreciation for the integrity and credibility of Scripture.
- The ability to work as a team and submit to leadership by following instruction, responding to evaluation and accepting advice
