2. The ______ (V. 20). 20 To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. Amen.

3. The ______ (Vs. 21-23). 21 Greet all the saints in Christ Jesus. The brothers who are with me send greetings. 22 All the saints send you greetings, especially those who belong to Caesar's household. 23 The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen. (NIV)
