CORAM MEDICAL POLICY

1. All medications will be kept in the health care station with the exception of rescue inhalers and Epi-pens. All medications must be labeled with the student's name, name of medication, strength, prescribed dosage, and name and phone number of the pharmacy.
2. Over-the-counter medications will be provided by the nurse and will be used in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. Students may not bring over-the-counter medications.
3. Over-the-counter medications will include: Acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, Benadryl, Lactaid, Imodium, antacids, and cough syrup.
4. The health care provider will be available in the health care station from 7:30 am to 8:00 pm and will be on call at night. Students experiencing symptoms of illness should be brought to him as soon as a problem is suspected. Students who are ill will be separated from other students until the nature of the illness is determined.
5. Students with injuries will be brought to the health care provider and appropriate first aid administered. If an injured student cannot be brought to him, they will be evaluated in the field and treated or transported to medical facilities as needed.
6. In the event that a student needs treatment at a medical facility (clinic or hospital), every effort will be made to notify the parent/guardian as soon as possible. The treating facility will communicate directly with the parent/guardian regarding insurance information, diagnosis, and plan of treatment.
7. Camp staff will remind students of safety and healthful practices as needed.
8. Pertinent conditions affecting the ability of the student to fully participate in all the activities and medical/food allergies will be disclosed at time of registration.
