LENT AND EASTER ARE COMING

Since earliest times, Easter has been at the center of the Christian year. Easter holds the key to understanding who Jesus is and why he is our Lord and Savior. As the apostle Paul put it, Jesus was *"declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead."* (Romans 1:4, NKJV)

A longstanding tradition of the Christian church has been the observance of Lent. Lent is a period of forty days beginning with Ash Wednesday and ending with Palm Sunday. It represents the forty days Jesus spent fasting and praying in the wilderness before he began his ministry. Because of this association, Lent has traditionally been a time for Christians to increase their spiritual practice. This Lenten season, I would encourage everyone at Cambrian Park UMC to make an effort to spend some time each day in prayer and reading the Bible.

This year, Ash Wednesday falls on February 13, Palm Sunday is March 24, Good Friday is March 29, and Easter Sunday is March 31.
