## December 2011 – November 2012

#### December 2011

- Esther's Outreach
- Held our first local, public-invited Christmas Carol Sing

- Completion of our solar project. Electricity "savings" began in February. "Green" ribbon-cutting ceremony took place in November 2011

- Submitted a balanced budget for 2012, first time in a few years. Reduced staffing (Music Director's position) in order to accomplish this
