GROUP DISCUSSION

As a group, discuss your thoughts and feelings about the following declarations. Which statements are easy to declare with certainty? Which are more challenging and why?

- I invest my time in others by praying for them.
- I spend a good deal of time helping others with physical, emotional, or other kinds of needs.
- I give away my time to serve and help others in my community.
- I regularly volunteer at my church.

Choose 2-3 questions that will lead to best discussion about the Key Idea

- 1. Make a diverse list of ways time can be used for God's purposes.
- 2. What challenges make it hard for you to invest time in God's purposes? As a group, discuss ways to overcome them.
- 3. Often, simple actions such as actively listening to a coworker, helping a neighbor, or coaching Little League are overlooked because they aren't "church related." Discuss simple ways you can offer time to people in your community.
- 4. In most churches, a small group of people do a majority of the work. Discuss different needs and opportunities you see within your congregation that your group could address.

Read Matthew 25:31-46 and choose 1-2 questions to discuss.

- Based on what you just read, what activities seem most important to Jesus?
- 2. The activities Jesus mentions are not usually considered acts done "for God," yet he says, "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." What do you think is Jesus' main point here?
- 3. Christians tend to narrowly define acts of worship as deeds done within a church building. As a group, redefine what it looks like to worship God with our time.

- 2. As you read the passages from Proverbs 3 and 11, identify the one piece of advice that speaks most to you right now.
- 3. If someone asked you to summarize what Jesus taught about money and giving, what would you way?
- 4. As you read the Scripture from 2 Corinthians 8 and 9, look for the process believers should go through to determine what to give.
- 5. On a scale of 1-10, evaluate your level of generosity. What has helped you become more generous? What still causes you to hold back?
