Obedience to God

Ministry in the workplace happens one of two ways. We are either called to a position of ministry and it's our job, or we are called to a job where we have opportunities to minister. Both are meaningful and vital to advancing the kingdom of God. Whichever scenario you can relate to, I'd like to propose that being obedient to God's call is pivotal in the success or failure of our ministries.

In November, I was called to serve at Voice of Hope Pregnancy Center, on staff, as the Resource Manager. On paper, the job description may not have seemed so glamorous, but it posed a challenge for me to stretch beyond what I felt my capabilities were. A popular quote kept coming to mind that says, "God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called." No truer words have been spoken as I jumped into this position where I truly felt called.

November and December were learning months for me as I sorted through files, documents and records trying to update and maintain some sense of order and balance. The majority of my work day was spent in my office behind my desk. When I interviewed for this position, I was asked if felt comfortable meeting with clients if the need arose. Of course my answer was "yes", however, until a few weeks ago no opportunity had presented itself. Just when we think our job is just a job, God calls us to follow through on our "yes". If we tell God "yes", we have to follow through. Saying "yes" and walking away is disobedience. Delayed obedience is disobedience, and sometimes there isn't a second chance to obey and follow through. I love how God will present ministry opportunities when we least expect them or feel most unprepared, because it's in those moments we learn to lean on and trust Him with everything.

One afternoon I was working quietly and three times distressed parents called seeking emergency assistance for diapers. Three times I was blessed with the opportunity to minister, pray with and give diaper assistance to these parents. Two of the calls were dads who were trying their hardest to care for their little ones. One father actually told me we were his last hope. He had called every other organization in town that offers assistance and we were his last call. If we couldn't help, he didn't what he was going to do.

When I told him we **could** help, he was overjoyed and showed up within minutes of hanging up the phone. As I was filling out some required paperwork, we talked about his children and how he is the primary caretaker. One of his children has some serious health issues which recently caused a terrifying experience. He stepped into the room where his children had been playing only to find his son on the floor having a seizure. He shared with me that he actually had to run outside and chase down a neighbor as she was driving away in order to call for emergency help. The neighbor glanced in her rearview mirror at just the right moment to see him running after her waving his arms for her to stop. They were able to call for help and his son was treated and is doing fine now.

I had an opportunity to pray for him and his family, and for the health of his little boy. I shared with him what God had placed on my heart, that sometimes God puts specific people in our lives at just the right moment for a specific purpose. I told him it was no accident, and certainly not coincidence, that his neighbor was right there and looked up at that moment. He agreed and pointed back at me and said the same was true of me. He believes, and so do I, that God brought him to Voice of Hope that day for more than just diapers. We are more than diapers, formula and a free bag of clothing. We are more than the curriculum that our clients learn from. We are caring, compassionate volunteers and committed, faithful staff seeking to be God's servants. We are HOPE for the lost and searching. We are obedient to God's call for this ministry. We are faithful servants with what God has placed before us.

We raised \$3,600 in Upper/Bucyrus walks and \$3,500 in Marion. Thanks to Modern Woodman of America's Matching funds and Kohl's Cares \$500 Contribution Voice of Hope has exceeded the \$10,000 goal. We would like to thank everyone who worked so hard to make the event a success. We know God is blessing this ministry.
