## Women at All Saints by Georgia Long

**Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me. Revelation 3:20** As I sat reflecting on us, the Women at All Saints....this Scripture came to mind. I realized that as we are closing the door to 2011, among other events, we have completed Bible Studies, enjoyed "Getting To Know You" sessions which were led weekly by a different woman with testimony and Scripture. Those weeks knitted us together in a sisterhood that we believe is just the beginning. We have celebrated Birthdays, and Birth-days; we have collect-

ed birthday gifts for foster children, blessed our own women, and gathered Christmas Gifts as well; we have lifted our voices in prayer and seen the favor of answered prayers.

And now it is January....that's where I believe the challenge of this Scripture began to unfold anew. January came from a Latin word that means door, thus January is the door to the year. European countries began officially making January 1 the start of the New Year - sometimes called *Circumcision Style* because this was the date of the **Feast of the Circumcision**, being the seventh day after December 25. January's birthstone is the **garnet** which represents **constancy**. So I began to sense that in this New Year we as a congregation surely, but also as women stand at a **new door**. We are on the inside and Jesus is outside knocking. There will be a newness that comes from new beginnings!! Beginning the new building, refining our ministries is just one part of it.

For the women attending Bible Study, we will begin a new study series on January 16 based on the book "The Holy Spirit and You" by Dennis and Rita Bennett. Our other events for the year are yet to be revealed, but our seeking will bring His leading. So the challenge to us all seems to be: are we willing, both individually and corporately to open new doors.....to acknowledge His voice...to open the door from the inside and allow Him to come in perhaps for the first time, or invite Him to re-enter and lead us once again into what He has for us? Will we be **constant** in our seeking, acknowledging, opening and continue on the path He has for us? I hope our answer, no matter how timorous, is yes Lord, yes Lord, yes.
