## A Note From Drew...

It is time to get ready for Easter at the Arena. March has come very quickly and

April 4<sup>th</sup> will be here before you know it. Please plan to come to the Easter service at the Palmer Arena, plan on bringing as many people as you can, be praying for the service and for those who will be there, and get excited about what God is going to do.

N. T. Wright is a Bishop in the Church of England. In his book *Surprised by Hope* he talks about celebrating Easter. "Is it any wonder people find it hard to believe in the resurrection of Jesus, if we don't throw our hats in the air? Is it any wonder we find it hard to live the resurrection, if we don't do it exuberantly in our liturgies? Is it any wonder the world doesn't take much notice, if Easter is celebrated as simply the one-day happy ending tacked on to forty days of fasting and gloom? It's long overdue that we took a hard look at how we keep Easter in church, at home, in our personal lives; right through the system... This is our greatest festival. Take Christmas away, and in Biblical terms you lose two chapters at the front of Matthew and Luke, nothing else. Take Easter away and you don't have a New Testament; you don't have Christianity; as Paul says you are still in your sins. This is our greatest day. We should put the flags out".

So let's get ready for a great day when we celebrate the greatest of days. *The battle is over, the victory has been won and Jesus Christ who was once dead is alive for evermore and He holds the keys of death and of Hades (Revelation 1:18).*

I want to thank all of you for your prayers, suggestions, and questions about going to four Sunday morning worship services. Thank you for taking part in our survey and for helping us think through all the details that will be involved in adding another service on Sunday morning.

Please remember the reason for going to four services is to allow room for growth, and remember that growth means souls won to Christ and added to the Kingdom. I know this change is going to take some learning and some adjustment, but it does allow us to provide space for new people to come. Some churches and individuals fight the challenges that come with growth and then stymie growth. Thank you for understanding and working together for God's honor and glory.

In Max Lucado's book *It's Not About Me*, the forward is by David Robinson, retired NBA basketball player. David writes "NBA championship teams have something in common; they play with one goal in mind. Each player contributes his own gifts and efforts so that the greater goal-winning can be reached. But players who seek their own glory at the sacrifice of the team's glory drive the team away from success. So it is with life. The goal is not our own glory. In fact, trying to make life 'all about us' pushes happiness further out of reach. Our society is not wired for this kind of thinking. It's a 'me-centric' world out there, which destroys much of what should be good."

One of the many things I have always appreciated about Second is the desire this church has to reach the lost, to make a difference in this world, and to grow the Kingdom, even when it means change or moving out of our comfort zone. God has blessed that effort, and, if we work together for His honor and glory, He will continue to bless. God will still do great things when His people trust and obey.

I want to give you a couple of reminders. Please read your Bible every day. Remember you will never grow a strong spiritual life apart from the Word of God. Also, remember that after Easter we are going to have a six-week Small Group Emphasis. We are looking for people who would be willing to host a group or facilitate a group. Let Dale know if you will help in this way.

Join me every Sunday as we worship and work together. See you this week.

So let's get ready for a great day when we celebrate the greatest of days.

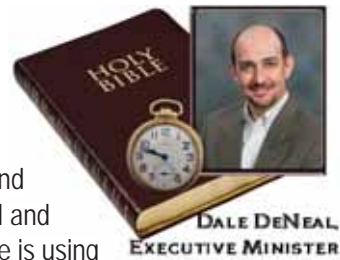

# Ministry Moment

Did you know there are over 40 active ministries here at Second? We would like to take a moment and let you see one of them in action each month. This month, the mission ministry is featured. Usually we tell you a little about what this ministry does, but this month we want to share with you what has been going on with one short-term mission trip that is being noticed outside our church walls. One of our teens went on a short-term mission trip to Haiti, and this is her story. (A story that will be published in *Church Executive* magazine, written by our own Dale DeNeal.) This is Amanda Stanton's story of her trip to Haiti.

## Amanda's Story of Haiti

Imagine you are 16 years old, never been out of the USA, and on the second day of your short-term mission trip a devastating earthquake cripples the tiny foreign country where you are serving. What would go through your mind? "How am I going to get home?" "Am I in danger?" "How do I let people back home know I'm OK?" "Am I OK?" If you are Amanda Stanton, a high school junior from Georgetown, IL, you are probably wondering, "What can I do to help?"

The day before the earthquake rocked Haiti on January 12, 2010, Amanda and her 25 member mission team landed in Port-au-Prince and traveled one hundred miles to the Northwest Haiti Christian Mission. Amanda's team planned to work primarily in the NWHCM orphanage. However, on day two the mission team conducted a worship service for local women. Amanda had just finished sharing her devotional to the assembly of women when the church building began to shake.

## Amanda's Story of Haiti (con't from page 3)



The Haitian women dropped to their knees and began singing loudly. "At first, everyone thought it was a movement of God," said Amanda. But as the rumbling continued, it became apparent they were not experiencing a spiritual event but a seismic event. A man ran into the crowd and shouted, "It's an earthquake – everyone get out!"

Amanda said, "The damage to buildings were mainly cracks, but people were afraid to go back in their homes for fear of aftershocks." The magnitude of the damage a hundred miles south in Port-au-Prince was not known until two days later when NWHCM mission staff returned with photos and stories. Amanda said, "That's when it hit me!" By the end of the week a plane was available to evacuate the short-term mission team. Amanda, however, chose to stay behind with four other team members. When asked why she didn't leave with the rest of the team, Amanda said, "I didn't feel my job was done. There was no way I was going to leave."



Amanda and the remaining team continued to work in the orphanage and wherever else they were needed. Meanwhile, much of the mission's resources and medical supplies were sent to Port-au-Prince. During the second week Amanda called her mother back in Illinois and found out that she had become a local celebrity with her photo and story appearing in newspapers and TV news reports. "At first I was upset" said Amanda, "but I thought about it for two days and I realized if I turned the media away the story will go away. If the media doesn't make it a big deal, then people won't make it a big deal."

At the end of the second week, Amanda and seven other people were crowded into the back of a small pickup truck called a "Tap Tap" where they spent the next eight hours trying to keep from being bounced out of the back. They spent the night in Cap-Haitien and boarded a flight to Miami the next day. Once on US soil, Amanda and the others saw for the first time the video of the suffering and carnage back in Haiti. Amanda said, "I shook in my boots!"



Back home Amanda found herself in the media spotlight. Seeing an opportunity, she used her celebrity status to speak to several organizations to raise both awareness of the need in Haiti and money to buy baby formula to send to Haiti. She also spoke at Second Church in all three services which resulted in people handing her over \$700 in cash to buy formula. Amanda said her kitchen at home and the backseat and trunk of her car are full of baby formula.

When asked how this experience has impacted her, Amanda said, "I lay awake at night and am thankful I have a bed to sleep in and a roof over my head. When I open the fridge I sometimes hate it that I have so much food and others do not!" Commenting about her future plans Amanda said, "Before [Haiti] I wanted to be a counselor, but now I want to be a counselor in Haiti. I would love to do that big time!"
