and seeking the will of God. The three parts of this vision are: (1) It is the dream of SCC to reach our communities with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. (2) It is the dream of SCC to equip our members to become devoted followers of Jesus Christ. And (3) It is the dream of SCC to impact our communities, nation and the world with the love of Jesus Christ.

We state in that second vision statement "The Great Commission compels the church to 'make disciples' (Matthew 28:19). We believe a disciple is a follower of Jesus Christ who is growing in community, spiritual maturity and active participation in the life of the church."

In order to be the church that God wants us to be, we must help everyone who comes here grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ. So this year we are going to be emphasizing spiritual growth. During September I am going to be preaching a series of messages about what is expected of those of us who are part of Second Church of Christ. I hope you will join me as we learn together what it means to be part of the Lord's church here at 2CC.

Sometimes, though, people remain spiritually immature (see I Corinthians 3:1-9 and Hebrews 5:11-14). I have observed that there are barriers to growth that keep us from becoming fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ. Such barriers are unresolved issues in our life (like anger, refusal to forgive, jealousy, and resentment), continual sin and disobedience to God, wrong attitudes, and sometimes just not making the effort to grow. I want to encourage all of us to understand that this relationship with Jesus Christ is a growing relationship. God wants to produce in us Christ-likeness (Romans 8:29). Read Galatians 5:22-26 to see the "fruit of the Spirit". That is what God will grow in us as we grow in Him. Together, let's grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ.

One way to grow is to get involved in a group or class. If you are not attending an Adult Bible Fellowship, please find one today. They meet during our first three services on Sunday mornings. Or maybe you are free on Tuesday morning; join me for our one-hour Bible study called Oasis. In just a few weeks we will begin Common Bond on Wednesday evenings and there will be several different opportunities to learn and grow. And of course, please be reading your Bible everyday.

It has now been four months since we started our four service format on Sunday morning and it is working. We now have room for new people to attend, we have started several new classes, there is room to park, and things are flowing smoothly.

So feel free to invite your friends and neighbors. Remember, if they say that Sunday is the only day they have to sleep in, tell them about the 11:30 service, and if they or you are going someplace on Sunday morning, remember our 7:45 service. Thank you for your prayers and support as we seek to reach more people with the good news of Jesus Christ and grow in Him. See you Sunday.

# TIME IN THE WORD

## The Word of God is the Sword of the Spirit

There are many practical benefits to spending time in the Word of God. One benefit that is not often discussed is that the Word of God is an important weapon we must use to counter the attacks of Satan. Often times this is called spiritual warfare. The Apostle Paul described the Word of God as the Sword of the Spirit in Ephesians 6:10-18. He said it is the primary weapon Christians must use when Satan tempts us and attacks us.

When Jesus fasted for 40 days in the wilderness after he was baptized, the Bible says that the Devil appeared to tempt him. Satan launched three attacks on Jesus and each time Jesus thwarted the Devil's attacks with scripture – the Sword of the Spirit. Three times Satan tempted Jesus and three times Jesus countered these temptations by saying, "It is written..." and then he quoted scripture.

As we spend time in the Word of God, we arm ourselves with a tremendous power that gives us the ability to repel Satan's attacks. In his book *How to Get the Most from God's Word*, John MacArthur talks about the subject of spiritual warfare and the importance of scripture:

*Every Christian possesses the equipment necessary to gain victory in the daily struggle against the world, the flesh, and the*

devil. The crucial weapon is the sword of the Spirit, the Word of God, which is likened to a small, easily wielded weapon used for close, precise work.

The two uses of the sword of the Spirit are defensive and offensive. On defense, we must learn to use the Word to parry the blows and thrusts of Satan, who is always trying to tempt us at our weakest point. On offense, we must be just as specific and precise as we wield the sword by teaching and sharing God's Word wherever we can to cut a swath through the devil's dark kingdom.

There are three approaches to God's Word which can be likened to three visitors in a beautiful flower garden. We can be butterflies who flutter about, obtaining little of real value, or we can be botanists who carefully study the details and the fine points of the flower but fail to find any real nourishment. Or we can be bees, who sink deep into God's word, going in empty and coming out, full of His truth, wisdom, and power.

How we choose to use our sword of the Spirit determines whether we will know the thrill of victory or the agony of defeat.

The Word of God is a powerful force in our lives if we consistently and faithfully spend time in it. I encourage you to read the following scriptures and reflect on the power God's Word can bring to your life as it relates to overcoming temptation and spiritual attacks. Spend time in the Word! (Matthew 4:1-11; Ephesians 6:10-18; Hebrews 4:12)

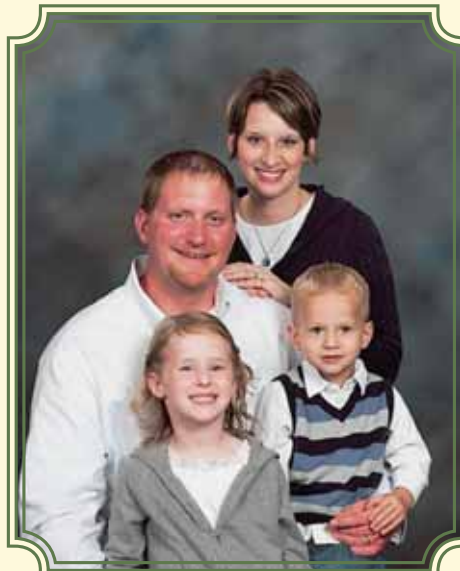

The high school students of Second are partnering with Children's Relief International to dig clean water wells in Mozambique, Africa. Statistics tell us that every 20 seconds a child in the world dies from a water-related disease. So in the time it takes you to read this one article, 1-2 children will die simply because they don't have the luxury of clean water. We understand that God has blessed us in incredible ways, and we want to be a blessing to others. On Saturday, September 18<sup>th</sup>, students will be doing a walk-a-thon to help raise money for a well. A well costs \$3,100, and the high school students and sponsors have already given around \$2,000 toward one well. We would love to be able to bless others in Mozambique with two or three wells! There are envelopes available for you to put your donation in.

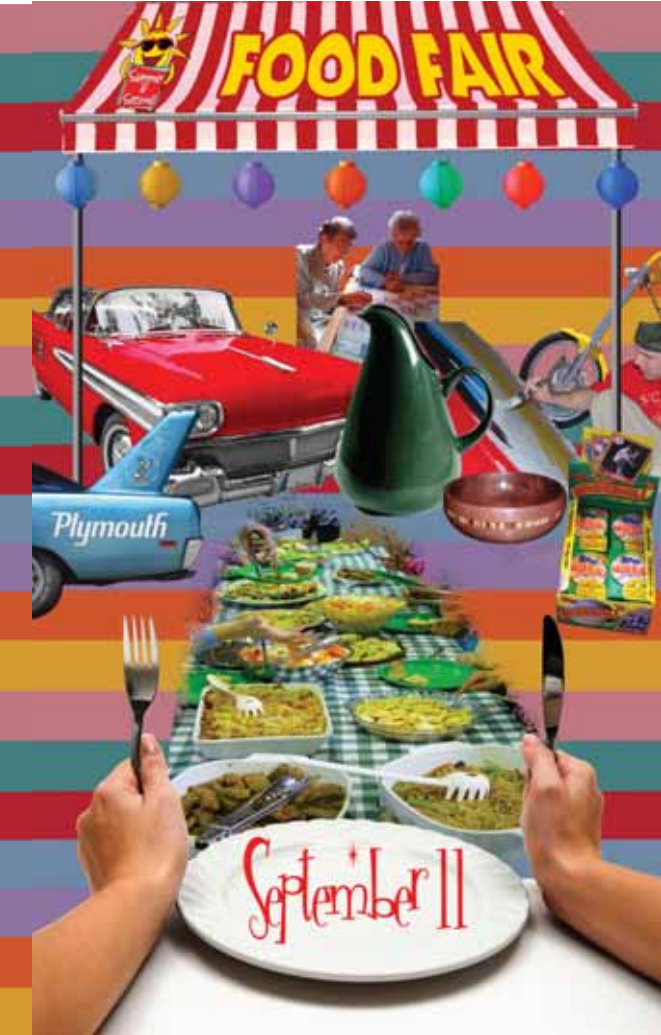
