

## TIME IN THE WORD

I am writing this article from the National Missionary Convention in Lexington, KY. Over 300 mission organizations are represented here at the convention and they all have one goal: teaching people around the world about Jesus. The methods these missions use to tell people about Jesus are as unique as the cultures they are trying to reach, but they all have the same foundation for their message – the Word of God.



The Word of God is as central to the work of missionaries as it is for the work of Second Church of Christ. So why is the Word of God the common denominator for Kingdom work in Danville, IL and the world? It is because the Word of God has the power to change lives regardless of the culture where it is presented. Romans 10:17 says "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ." It is the word of God/Christ that brings people to faith and it is through faith that we grow to become fully devoted followers of Christ.

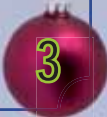
