It is almost time for Celebrate America, and I hope you have moved it to the top of your prayer and priority list. This has the possibility of having a great impact on our communities if we all pray, work together and trust God to work through us. Please pray

for the event, and please be inviting people to join you at the Palmer Arena on Saturday night, September 10th, at 6:00 p.m.

Here are some other things you can do to help with Celebrate America. Pass out invitation cards, sign up to help with set-up on Friday and Saturday and with tear-down on Sunday afternoon. Arrive at the Arena early on Saturday ready to help where ever needed. Remembering we are the hosts of this event, greet everyone you can and make all feel welcomed. After the event on Saturday, help with clean-up so we can be ready for Sunday morning. And again, please continue to pray that God will work through us as we work for Him.

Please remember that we will be having our Sunday morning worship on September 11th at the Arena. Of course this is open to everyone, but we are not doing as much publicity about this Sunday morning service. It will be mostly our own people. Because the attendance will be smaller on Sunday morning, we will block off some seating so you might not get your "favorite seat". But Sunday morning is going to be a special service-all of us together in one service and some special things will happen at that service. The choir will be singing, we will worship together and I will share some things about the theme for the coming year.

We are invited to attend the *Tribute to Everyday Heroes* that Sunset will be holding on Sunday afternoon September 11th at 3:00 p.m. We are working with Sunset in advertising, but we will not take part in their program on Sunday afternoon. But it will be worth your while if you can attend. It will be at Sunset Memorial Park.

Time In The Word

Illuminating Your Life Through God's Word & Spirit

God's Word, the Bible, supplies Christ-followers with divine truth that provides illumination to life. The psalmist describes the illuminating effect of God's Word as "...a lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalms 119:105). However, the simple act of reading the Bible is no guarantee that someone will experience spiritual illumination. Why is this so?

The apostle Paul sheds some light on this issue in 1 Corinthians 2:14: "The man without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually discerned." Paul is saying that without the Holy Spirit, people are unable to understand the divine truth that comes from God; and the primary source of divine truth is the Bible.

Think of it this way. If the Bible were a flashlight, then the Holy Spirit is the battery. A flashlight is only useful if the power source is good. Have you every grabbed a flashlight out of a drawer during a power outage only to discover the batteries were dead or so weak that the light emanating from the bulb was useless? In much the same way, reading the



Bible without the power of the Holy Spirit is almost an effort in futility.

Paul's prayer in Ephesians 1:17-19 clearly speaks to the necessity of Christ-followers to tap into the power of the Holy Spirit in order to bring about illumination for their lives.

"I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and his incomparably great power for us who believe."

Paul prays earnestly that God would grant the spirit of wisdom to his readers, eyes that are enlightened through the Holy Spirit to understand what is written and know the exceeding greatness of His power working in all who believe.

Andrew Murray says, "Only through the Holy Spirit can the Christian understand the divine truth contained in God's Word."

Paul instructs us that when we read God's Word, or meditate on it, we should pray, "Father, grant me the spirit of wisdom and revelation."

As we do this each day, we will find that God's living and powerful Word is illuminating our lives with immeasurable brilliance.

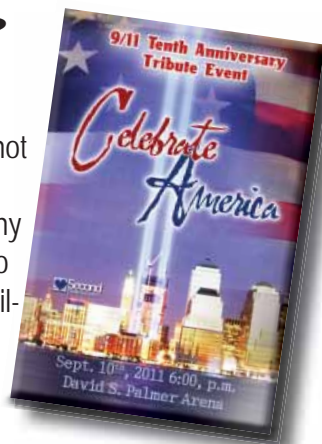
