Wednesday, February 14: Ash Wednesday

LUST: "Giving Love a Bad Name: David, Bathsheba, and 7 Deadly Sins" (2 Sam. 11:1-12:8)

Join us for our meal at 5:45, some singing of love songs in the fellowship hall from 6:25-6:40 (it is, after all, Valentine's Day as well), and then our Ash Wednesday service in the sanctuary, which highlights how King David's missteps and snowballing sin help us—during Lent—to look at our own lives.

Wednesday, February 21 ENVY: FROM CONFLICT TO PEACE IN MODERN ISRAEL: CHALLENGES IN DAILY LIFE with Nancy Chapman and Craig Wansink

Join Craig and Nancy as they reflect on some of their personal experiences in Israel (during their January tour and travels there), including their reflections on envy and some fascinating challenges in that country:

Why have Christian priests viciously attacked each other in Jerusalem's Church of the Holy Sepulcher? Why are Bibles not allowed on the Temple Mount? Why do some ultra-orthodox Jewish men throw chairs at women who pray at the Western Wall? What is so controversial about where the U.S. embassy to Israel is located? What constitutes "Jewishness" and who determines that?

FROM THE PASTOR: THE SEVEN DEADLY SINS

In the early 1970s, Karl Menninger wrote a classic book entitled *Whatever Became of Sin?* The book highlighted the ways in which people have stopped framing weaknesses and faults in their lives as "sin." But sin absolutely is a reality. We can't focus on it too much; we need to focus on moving beyond it. But we also can't ignore that which leads us astray from God. Maxie Dunnam and Kimberly Dunnam Reisman, in a book entitled *The Workbook on the Seven Deadly Sins*, remind us of how each of these sins can cause decay, weakness, and corruption in our lives. The following quotations in particular stand out to me, because each one makes me pause and think.

—SLOTH: "Laziness prevents us from loving. Loving requires decision; it's a matter of the will. We decide to love . . . If love were feeling, Jesus couldn't command us to love."

—AVARICE: "Avarice is self-love in one of its most perverted forms. It is protecting ourselves and hoarding what we have. We can hold a penny so close to our eye that it blocks out the sun. Avarice does that. It blocks out the light and concern for others. We have never known a happy miser."

—LUST: "Lust is the craving for salt of a person who is dying of thirst." (Frederick Buechner)

--GLUTTONY: "Gluttony has no perspective; it is excessive and preoccupied with satisfying self. Feasting keeps perspective; it celebrates God's bounty, and encourages eating with a grateful heart and sharing with others."



—PRIDE: "Genuine humility is never weak.... We make a big mistake when we begin to think that sinful pride can be overcome through self-contempt. That's not humility. Humility enhances our self-worth and makes us more like Christ."

---ENVY: "Envy is calculating; love and mercy are not . . . Not only does envy refuse to recognize God's goodness to us, it refuses to rejoice in God's goodness to others."

—ANGER: "We must always seek to be sure that our anger is righteous and our indignation moral. George Matheson prayed, 'O Lord, Thou knowest that I do well to be angry, but I have mistaken the times.' That may be the right prayer for all of us."

Each week as we gather and join in the communal confession of sin, part of what we are doing is recognizing that sin gets in the way of our relationships with others and with God. Part of what we are doing is acknowledging that we were created by God, for God, and that our hearts find no true rest until we find ourselves in God. Please join us this Lent in worship, in Sunday School, and on Wednesday evenings.


AMERICAN IDOLS: OVERCOMING 7 OF OUR MOST FAVORITE SINS

Gluttony, Envy, Lust, Pride, Sloth, Anger, and Greed. Since the Middle Ages, Christianity has pointed to these sins or tendencies as separating us—or ripping us away—from God. Most of these sins represent good gifts from God that we have a tendency to misuse. During the seven weeks of Lent, join us as we focus on the gifts beyond the sin, as we consider how we can live lives worthy of our calling.

Law professor and humorist Jay Wexler writes that . . .


-In New York, Miami, and other large US cities, Santeria followers sprinkle mercury in their apartments to fend off witches, poisiong those homes for years to come.


