## FROM THE PASTOR: FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT

"They'll know we are Christians by our love." When I was a child, I sang those words with enthusiastic fervor, largely because the song had a nice beat. It felt like it was lifted from a Native American rawhide drum or dance. As I grew older and then realized that sometimes we Christians aren't always known for our kindness and loving behavior, I didn't care for the song at all. It felt like hyperbole or pride. But then, again later, when I actually listened to the song, I realized that the song points to the future, to a hope that one day people will look at us and see something so different and so meaningful in our love that they will realize that it comes from a different source. Like when Dorothy Days says, "I really only love God as much as I love the person I love the least." Love that people actually would notice would be a

very different kind of love, a self-sacrificial love.

We still are not close to that. Today I'm watching news reports on challenges within the United Methodist denomination, and I see a wide variety of individuals—with an extremely wide array of perspectives—who aren't communicating those perspectives with love. And Presbyterians aren't that different from them.

How do people know we are Christians? By our love? By our patience, joy, or self-control? The apostle Paul says that we should be able to identify Christians through nine fruit of the Spirit, nine characteristics that flow from those individuals, because they are rooted in God.

Each of us is full of all sorts of stuff. It grows in us, because of the ways we think, act, or spend our time. Paul says that if we are rooted in God, some clear characteristics—or fruit—come forth from us. Others will see in us patience, gentleness, self-control, peace, and joy. That is the sort of stuff that spills out of our interactions when we are with others.

I know that sometimes when I am stressed out, it isn't peace or patience

that spills out in my encounters. Rather, maybe others will see fear, frustration, or irritability. But I have been blessed to see Christian friends whose fruit I hope to emulate or grow into.

Lent—the time before Easter—is a time for us to get rid of bad behavior and embrace new ways of living. Please join us in worship and on Wednesday evenings for the next seven weeks, as we try to cultivate in our lives the kind of fruit that matters.

# Taking Back the Bible: Elizabeth Cady Stanton's Scriptural Battle on Behalf of Slaves and Women

The 19th-century abolitionist Elizabeth Cady Stanton was not a religious person, but she recognized how people in her day frequently used the Bible to justify slave hunting and the suppression of women's rights. Using scripture then as a leverage point, she wrote two visceral and provocative works: *The Slave's Appeal* (1860) and *The Woman's Bible* (1895, 1898), which fought both slavery and the suppression of women's rights.




